Posting Language

Authorize negotiation and execution of a one-year service agreement with the City of Austin to manage and operate various housing programs on the City of Austin's behalf during Fiscal Year 2020-21 to be funded by United States Department of Housing and Urban Development funds and local housing funds in an amount not to exceed \$75,604,657.

Lead Department

Neighborhood Housing and Community Development.

Fiscal Note

Funding is available in the Fiscal Year 2020-2021 Operating and Capital Budgets of the Austin Housing Finance Corporation (AHFC). Grant funding is contingent on the release of Program Year 2020 federal funds from U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). See attached AHFC Grant Operating Budget- Exhibit A and AHFC Capital Budget- Exhibit B for more detail. This item has no fiscal impact.

Additional Backup Information:

This action authorizes staff to negotiate and execute the annual service agreement between the Austin Housing Finance Corporation (AHFC) and the City of Austin (City). The agreement is funded with federal and local housing funds in the amount of \$75,604,657. The AHFC will manage and operate various City housing programs during Fiscal Year 2020-2021, including homeless assistance, renter assistance, homebuyer assistance, homeowner assistance, and housing development assistance. Additional information is available in AHFC's Grant Operating Budget and Capital Budget. An estimated 1,137 services will be provided to households through these programs.

Established in 1979 as a public, non-profit corporation pursuant to Chapter 394 of the Texas Local Government Code, the AHFC administers numerous affordable housing programs for the City using federal and local funds. U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development grant funds provided by the City constitute the majority of the AHFC's grant funds.
