54 Propositions A and B; **NOW, THEREFORE**,

55 **BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:**

56           The Council finds that all of the recitals contained in this resolution are true  
57 and adopts them as findings of fact by this governing body; and

58           The Council finds that the results of the general election as tabulated and  
59 canvassed reflect the votes cast at the election; and

60           The Council accepts and approves the returns for the general election, as  
61 tabulated and received and canvassed, and declares that the following persons are  
62 declared elected and may qualify for the office indicated for terms that begin  
63 January 6, 2021:

64           City Council Member District 2           Vanessa Fuentes

65           City Council Member District 4           Gregorio “Greg” Casar

66           City Council Member District 7           Leslie Pool; and

67           In order to elect a City Council Member for District 6 and a City Council  
68 Member for District 10, the City Council shall order a runoff election as soon as is  
69 practicable and no later than the fifth day after this canvass as required by state law  
70 (Texas Election Code § 2.024).

71           The Council finds that the results of the special election as tabulated and  
72 canvassed reflect the votes cast at the election; and

73           The Council accepts and approves the returns for the special election, as  
74   tabulated and received and canvassed, and declares that Proposition A and  
75   Proposition B are adopted.

76           With this canvass, Council is making official the precinct returns received  
77   from the counties.
