68 69 70	(B)	Except as provided in Subsection (C), the department shall provide activity leaders during a recreational program that includes swimming in a wading pool at a minimum as follows:		
71 72		(1) one activity leader for each five participants of five years of age; and		
73		(2) one activity leader for each 12 participants six to 13 years old.		
74 75 76 77	(C)	During a recreational program designed for participants with a disability that includes swimming in a swimming pool or wading pool, the department shall provide one activity leader for each eight participants five to 13 years old.		
78 79 80 81	(D)	The department may not conduct a recreational program at a swimming pool or wading pool outside a City park unless the use of the pool has been approved by the director.		
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PART 7. REQUIREMENTS FOR ACTIVITY LEADERS. 82 (A) The department shall provide a minimum of one activity leader for 83 each class or group enrolled in a recreational program. 84 (B) An activity leader must be at least: 85 (1) 18 years old; or 86 (2) 15 years old if supervised by another activity leader who is at 87 least 18 years old. 88 (C) An activity leader must retain the following certification from a 89 nationally recognized organization approved by the director: 90 (1) basic water rescue, or equivalent, as approved by the director, if 91 supervising a recreational program that includes swimming; 92 cardiopulmonary resuscitation for adults, children, and infants; (2) 93 use of an automated external defibrillator; and (3) 94 first aid. (4) 95 PART 8. STAFF AND VOLUNTEER TRAINING REQUIREMENTS. 96 The director shall establish training requirements for all staff and (A) 97 volunteers who provide direct care or supervision to participants. 98 At least one staff member at each facility must have current training in (B) 99 first aid, automated external defibrillator, and cardiopulmonary 100 resuscitation for adults, children, and infants from a nationally 101 recognized program that has been approved by the director. 102 Each staff member who supervises children in swimming or other 103 (C) water activities shall be trained in basic water rescue, or equivalent, as 104 approved by the director. A person who is not counted in the 105 minimum staff-to-participant ratio is not required to meet these 106 requirements. 107 108

110 111	(A)	A person may not be employed or serve as a volunteer in a recreational program if:

119 120	(B)	The director may obtain a criminal history record of any employee or volunteer working or applying to work in a recreational program.
121	PART 10.	FACILITY OPERATION; PHYSICAL ENVIRONMENT.
122 123	(A)	The department may not operate a recreational program at a facility unless the facility meets the following requirements:
124 125 126		(1) The facility and equipment used in the program do not present fire, health, or safety hazards and are kept free of refuse and debris.
127		(2) The facility is inspected annually for safety by the department.
128		(3) The facility is kept free of insects, rodents, and stray animals.
129		(4) The facility has clearly marked emergency exits.
130 131		(5) The facility has a disaster and evacuation procedure posted in a visible location.
132 133 134 135		(6) The facility is used and maintained in accordance with the fire prevention requirements of City Code Chapter 25-12 (<i>Technical Codes</i>) and the fire chief's directives, including not fewer than four fire drills each year.

Staff shall call a participant's parent or guardian if participant has an (C) 162 oral temperature of 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit or greater, accompanied 163 by behavioral changes or other signs or symptoms of illness. 164 (D) Staff may not admit or readmit a participant whose illness or medical 165 condition prevents the participant from comfortably participating in 166 program activities or in places where other participants may be put at 167 risk for the duration of the illness or condition. 168 (E) In the case of an acute illness or injury to a participant, staff shall call 169 for an emergency vehicle to transport the participant to an authorized 170 medical facility. 171 PART 12. MEDICATION STANDARDS. 172 (A) A staff member may not administer medication to a participant without 173 a parental medication authorization. Staff may not administer 174 medication that is not in its original container or past the expiration 175 date on the container. 176 A staff member may not administer an injection or an amount of (B) 177 medication that is inconsistent with the prescribed dosage. A staff 178 member may administer an epinephrine auto-injector device if the staff 179 member has completed training approved by the department. 180 (C) A staff member may not accept more than a one-week supply of 181 medication for a participant, and the staff member shall return the 182 unused medication to the parent on the last program day of the week. 183 (D) Staff must keep medication in a secured location that is not accessible 184 by participants. 185 A staff member shall maintain a medication log that includes the name (E) 186 of the child to whom the medication is administered, the time the 187 medication is dispensed, and the name of the person dispensing the 188 medication. 189 190 191
