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The City Manager is directed to offer educational outreach to employers, with a targeted focus on those with vulnerable workforces and frontline personnel, to encourage vaccine support programs that increase access to vaccines by employees and grant time-off to those wishing to secure them.

25 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:**

26 The City Manager is directed to identify existing funding or funds the City
27 receives under the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, able and available to be used
28 to address the continued impact of COVID-19 by:

- 29 1. Prioritizing a mobile testing program and a mobile vaccine program for
30 seniors, homebound individuals, and minority, low-income
31 communities living in multi-generational settings;
 - 32 2. Increasing agriculture and nutrition programs for individuals living in
33 areas with limited access to grocery stores. This shall include a staff
34 analysis determining various contracting mechanisms and options to
35 achieve emergency food distribution to those negatively impacted by
36 COVID-19, which could also be activated during a natural disaster;
 - 37 3. Continuing support for small business assistance, including specific
38 programs for restaurants and live music venues, as well as creating new
39 grants for live music venues, art galleries, and cultural programming
40 venues; and
 - 41 4. Developing mental health services to address the impacts of the
42 COVID-19 pandemic and expanding partnerships with existing
43 partners and contractors to provide mental health services. This shall
44 also include an accessible online platform serving to connect the public
45 to local mental health care services.
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47 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:**

48 The City Manager is directed to report back to Council no later than April 16,
49 2021 regarding identified funding and methods for implementing or continuing the
50 listed programs, and the status of educational efforts with targeted employers.
