



COVID-19 Travis County New Confirmed Cases








COVID-19 AUSTIN MSA CURRENT HOSPITALIZATIONS, ICU ADMISSIONS, AND VENTILATOR USE




Daily COVID-19 Hospital Admissions in the Austin-Round Rock MSA (7 day moving average)




Daily COVID-19 Hospitalizations in the Austin-Round Rock MSA



Daily COVID-19 ICU patients in the Austin-Round Rock MSA




City of Austin - Travis County COVID-19 Hospitalization by Age Group (Austin MSA)






City of Austin - Travis County COVID-19 Count of Weekly Hospitalizations by Age Group (Austin MSA)






City of Austin - Travis County COVID-19 Hospitalization by Race & Ethnicity (Austin MSA)







City of Austin - Travis County COVID-19 Count of Weekly Hospitalizations by Race/Ethnicity (Austin MSA)




Percent Positive by Test Collection Week and Year - Last 12 Weeks



Stage 3 Recommendations

· Wear a mask, social distance, and practice good hygiene

Avoid gatherings with social groups greater than 10 people



Vaccine Update

- A TOTAL of 203,932 vaccines have been administered at all hub locations
- A total of **30,056** vaccines were administered last week
 - 1,047 administered through the Mobile Vaccine Program (MVP)
 - 543 administered at St. James Church as part of the Faith based Vaccine efforts

Vaccine for Childcare, Education, and Senior Population Update

Childcare/School Staff

• ~11,953 school and child-care staff have been vaccinated have been vaccinated with at least one dose

Senior Population

- Doses through APH (60 years and older as of 4/1):
 - First dose ~56,000
 - Second dose: ~35,000

DSHS total

~70,842 Travis County residents 65 years or older have been vaccinated with at least one dose



40 years or older can now schedule

Main release of appointments for FIRST DOSES go live Monday & Thursday evenings



Expanding Vaccine Eligibility in Increments

- Beginning Apr. 5, Austin Public Health (APH) expanded scheduling of COVID-19 vaccine appointments to more members of the public while still prioritizing by age and risk for severe disease
- While main appointment releases have been happening on Mondays, release times and dates can vary week to week as operations change
- The scheduler will be open until the stated closing time or when all appointments are filled



City of Austin Employee Vaccines

- APH and HRD have vaccinated 3,400 employees through the Public Safety Wellness Clinic.
- Last week **574** employees were registered to receive the first dose of the vaccine.
- This week, two locations will provide vaccine:
 - 1) APH/HRD Public Safety Wellness Clinic Wednesday and Thursday (300 shots each day).
 - Employees have received Citywide communication with the APH link
 - Employees register via link
 - Employees email HRD a list is developed and sent to APH identifying them as a COA employee
 - Employees receive an email or phone call through the Equity Line for employees with no computer access with date/time of appointment
 - 2) HRD HealthyConnections Wellness Program through Randalls at the Learning and Resource Center on Friday (250 shots)
