

**RESOLUTION NO.**

**WHEREAS**, the Austin Strategic Housing Blueprint’s permanent supportive housing goal is too low and does not reflect the City Council’s priorities and current community needs; and

**WHEREAS**, a community-led Homelessness Summit held between March 23 and April 15, 2021 established the goal of housing over 3,000 people experiencing homelessness in three years, **including revamping our response system; providing housing stabilization such as prevention, diversion and rapid exit; fully rehousing across the spectrum of need; and specifically** including the development of 1,000 units of permanent supportive housing; **NOW, THEREFORE;**

**BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:**

The City Council directs the City Manager to amend the Austin Strategic Housing Blueprint to reflect the following goals:

- Unlock 3,000+ Homes by 2024 through a collaboration between local governments, businesses, and philanthropy with the goal of **rehousing encampments equitably and** significantly reducing Austin's unsheltered population, **and setting a course to reach equilibrium on unsheltered homelessness by 2026 in which the homelessness response system has a rehousing intervention within 30 days for all persons experiencing homelessness.**
  - Secure 2,300 rental units in the market using landlord incentives
  - Provide capital funds for at least 350 Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH) units per year beginning in FY2022
