2	WHEREAS, the Austin Strategic Housing Blueprint's permanent supportive
3	housing goal is too low and does not reflect the City Council's priorities and
4	current community needs; and
5	WHEREAS, a community-led Homelessness Summit held between March 23 and
6	April 15, 2021 established the goal of housing over 3,000 people experiencing
7	homelessness in three years, including revamping our response system; providing
8	housing stabilization such as prevention, diversion and rapid exit; fully rehousing
9	across the spectrum of need; and specifically including the development of 1,000
10	units of permanent supportive housing; NOW, THEREFORE,
11	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:
12	The City Council directs the City Manager to amend the Austin Strategic
13	Housing Blueprint to reflect the following goals:
14	• Unlock 3,000+ Homes by 2024 through a collaboration between local
15	governments, businesses, and philanthropy with the goal of significantly
16	reducing Austin's unsheltered population. Such a collaboration would
17	rehouse those living in encampments equitably and set a course to reach
18	equilibrium on unsheltered homelessness in which the homelessness
19	response system has a rehousing intervention within 30 days for all persons
20	experiencing homelessness.

22	<ul> <li>Provide capital funds for at least 350 Permanent Supportive Housing</li> </ul>
23	(PSH) units per year beginning in FY2022
