## **RESOLUTION NO.** 1 2 WHEREAS, all Austinites deserve a healthy and safe home; and 3 **WHEREAS**, a healthy and safe home is a home free from mold; and WHEREAS, Winter Storm Uri has caused an increase in health and safety issues 4 for Austinites, including significant water damage and leaks leading to mold 5 6 growth and diminished air quality; and **WHEREAS**, mold is known to cause health issues, such as shortness of breath, 7 8 skin and eye irritation, asthma, allergies, and other respiratory ailments; and 9 **WHEREAS**, communities of color and working class communities are disparately 10 impacted by unsafe and unhealthy housing conditions; and WHEREAS, renters often rely on City enforcement to get their landlords to 11 address health and safety issues in their homes; and 12 13 **WHEREAS**, currently, no city department has explicit authority to regulate mold and address tenant complaints of mold in their homes; and 14 WHEREAS, renters do not have reliable recourse with the City of Austin to 15 ensure their landlords address mold and often do not have the resources or ability 16 17 to address the issues themselves; and 18 **WHEREAS**, local governments across the country differ on how they regulate and enforce mold issues, including whether they enforce through a code, health, or 19 20 housing department; and

- 21 **WHEREAS**, Austin should improve its regulation and enforcement of mold as a
- 22 health and safety issue; **NOW, THEREFORE**,

23	BE IT RESULVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:
24	The City Council directs the City Manager to improve the City's response to
25	addressing health and safety issues related to mold and rental housing. The City
26	Manager should provide a report by August 13, 2021 on health and safety issues
27	related to mold and rental housing and should take the steps necessary to
28	implement recommendations as needed to improve the City's response. The report
29	shall include:
30 31	• a survey of state and local government regulations, complaint processes, and enforcement practices regarding mold,
32 33	<ul> <li>whether specific relocation assistance is provided during mold remediation in other jurisdictions,</li> </ul>
34	• whether the regulations pertain to rental or non-rental properties,
35 36	<ul> <li>what existing resources exist for mold remediation through FEMA or other sources, and</li> </ul>
37	<ul> <li>recommendations for the City of Austin based on best practices,</li> </ul>
38	including which department should enforce mold regulations, how we
39	can facilitate access to existing resources for financing mold remediation,
40	and the resources needed to enact the recommendations.
