<b>Proposed Regulation</b>	The proposed adoption of the 2021 Uniform Mechanical Code and local amendments would replace the 2015 Uniform Mechanical Code and corresponding amendments. The local amendments include responsive items to past Council action, compliance with 2007 water conservation regulatory mandates, additional work exempt from permit, references to elements of the 2021 International Mechanical Code, and other clarifications.
