Posting Language

Authorize negotiation and execution of a cooperative contract with Dell Marketing LP, for tracking location software licensing and maintenance services, for a term of 40 months for a total contract amount not to exceed \$734,000.

Multiple vendors within this cooperative purchasing program were reviewed for these goods and services. The Purchasing Office has determined this contractor best meets the needs of the department to provide the goods and services required at the best value for the City.

Additional Backup Information:

The contract is for tracking location software licensing and maintenance services. The Absolute Resilience software is utilized by Communications and Technology Management and Public Safety on devices, and performs device location of the entire fleet, remotely wipes, or locks down compromised devices, selectively wipes data from at-risk endpoints, and mitigates most risk scenarios relative to the endpoint. The software and

continued maintenance are critical for the security of these sensitive City devices.
