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Additional Backup Information:

The City of Austin Corridor Program Office is constructing improvements to the Airport Boulevard Corridor to increase safety, mobility, and connectivity for everyone. This project will include the addition of shared-use paths on both sides of the roadway, new and upgraded traffic signals with enhanced technology, improved intersections, reduced conflict points, new protected pedestrian crossings (PHBs), and drainage improvements. This segment of Airport Boulevard between North Lamar Boulevard and 55th Street is approximately 1.5 miles.

Through the 2016 Mobility Bond, the Corridor Program Office was awarded \$482 million. From this allotment, funding was allocated to design and construct mobility and safety improvements to Airport Boulevard. From this, Airport Boulevard between North Lamar Boulevard and 55th Street is funded through construction.

A portion of Airport Boulevard passes through Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) right-of-way (ROW) at US 290. These mobility and safety improvements require a multiple-use agreement (MUA) between the City of Austin and TxDOT to establish roles and responsibilities for construction and maintenance of the improvements within TxDOT ROW.
