

## AUSTIN CITY COUNCIL MINUTES

SPECIAL CALLED MEETING MONDAY, OCTOBER 4, 2021

The City Council of Austin, Texas, convened in a Joint Special Called Meeting with Capital Metro Board of Trustees and Austin Transit Partnership Board of Trustees on Monday, October 4, 2021 at Austin Central Library, 710 W Cesar Chavez St. Austin, TX and via videoconference.

Mayor Adler called the Council Meeting to order at 1:09 p.m.

## COUNCIL DISCUSSION

 Staff briefing and discussion on partnership agreements and potential amendments and waivers to City Code, regulations, and fees to implement Project Connect.

The following direction was provided to staff: provide a copy of the proposed meeting schedule to Council including which meetings public participation will be allowed and if the meetings will be televised; update on the plans for implementation of the apprenticeships in the workforce; clarification to Section 5.2.1.3 to clarify that funding is provided by ATP; consider including additional criteria manuals in Part 3 of the ordinance; provide justification for forgoing review by the Planning Commission; provide justification for the broad waiver powers of the City Manager in the Be It Further Resolved clause of the resolution; suggested language that would ensure compliance with environmental regulations and provide examples of the type of waivers that would be made; provide redline version of revised documents in advance of the October 29th, 2021 Joint meeting: provide more structure in the Joint Powers Agreement relating to plans for keeping the Community Advisory Committee involved; include the Community Advisory Committee to Section 2.1.4 of the Agreement; provide a list of possible conflicts that exist between Austin Transit Partnership and Capital Metro; provide a response to the questions received by labor advocates; include language in Section 3.1 o the Agreement that ensures commitment to equity; Section 4.4.1 add specificity on the process for the funding for displacement; provide any differences in the Agreement and the Council Contract with Voters relating to Better Building standards; provide suggestions on ways to keep all bodies involved aware of the progress and status of the project; provide more frequent reporting to the governing bodies in Section 4.4.1; include priority disadvantage businesses in Section 3.3.2; plans for developing a dispute resolution process; provide information on whether Project Connect be paying permitting fees; consider scheduling more than one annual joint meeting in Section 4.2.3; include a list of equity policies in Section 4.3.

Mayor Adler adjourned the Council Meeting at 4:23 p.m. without objection.

The minutes were approved on this the 4<sup>th</sup> day of November 2021 on Council Member Alter's motion, Council Member Ellis' second on a 11-0 vote.
