ANALYSIS / ADDITIONAL INFORMATION: Funds will be used to supplement the operating budget of the PARD Senior Transportation Program, which has been providing rides for over three decades. The program provides transportation to pre-qualified individuals with the goal of enhancing quality of life and promoting independence for persons 60 years or older residing in the Austin city limits. Three types of transportation are offered: 1) Regular Routes/Lunch Program is a free service that provides reliable service from the patron's door to nearest congregate meal lunch locations and back home again; 2) Reserve-a-Ride is a door-to-door service to and from the requested destination within Austin city limits for a fee of \$6.00 roundtrip; and 3) Group Travel (at least 7 riders) is offered to destinations within the Austin city limits for \$6 roundtrip per rider.

The proposed grant will provide partial funding for the program for the period October 1, 2021 through September 30, 2023. This funding will support the staff expansion of three additional part-time drivers and one part-time dispatcher which is needed to keep up with the increasing demand.

The General Fund will not be required to contribute additional funds beyond those currently budgeted to this grant. When the grant funds expire, the Parks and Recreation Department's need for continuing funding will be evaluated and may be denied.
