L5	veteran support services passing Resolution No. 20170622-035 directing the City
L6	Manager to draft a business plan to establish a Veterans Resource Center; and
L7	WHEREAS, the Commission on Veterans Affairs passed Recommendation
L8	No. 20200115-B003 encouraging City Council to create a Department of Veterans
19	and Military Affairs; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN: 21 The City Manager is directed to explore the establishment of a Veterans and 22 Military Affairs Office.
