## CITY OF AUSTIN DECLARATION OF DISASTER IN RESPONSE TO DECLARATIONS OF DISASTER CAUSED BY SEVERE WEATHER

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## Recitals

WHEREAS, beginning in the early morning hours of February 3, 2022, the City of Austin, a Texas home rule city located in Travis, Hays, and Williamson counties, began experiencing severe winter weather, including dangerous ice conditions and extremely cold temperatures from Winter Storm Landon; and

WHEREAS, persons within the City of Austin may be severely impacted by the severe winter weather with an imminent threat of widespread and severe property damage, injury, and loss of life; and

WHEREAS, severe weather conditions will make roads unsafe and may impede the ability to provide necessary and timely emergency response; and

WHEREAS, on February 3, 2022, Governor Greg Abbott issued a Proclamation declaring a state of disaster due to a severe ice storm posing an imminent threat of severe property damage, injury, or loss of life and declaring a state of disaster in specified Texas counties, including Bosque, Dallas, Delta, Denton, Ellis, Fannin, Grayson, Hopkins, Hunt, Johnson, Kaufman, Lamar, Navarro, Rains, Red River, Rockwall, and Williamson counties pursuant to §418.017 of the Texas Government Code; and

WHEREAS, as set forth in the February 3, 2022 Proclamation and pursuant to Section 418.017 of the Texas Government Code, the Governor authorized the use of all available resources of state government and of political subdivisions that are reasonably necessary to cope with this disaster; and

WHEREAS, as set forth in the February 3, 2022 Proclamation and pursuant to Section 418.016 of the Texas Government Code, any regulatory statute prescribing the procedure for conduct of state business or any order or rule of a state agency that would in any way prevent, hinder, or delay necessary action in coping with this disaster shall be suspended upon written approval of the Office of the Governor. However, to the extent that the enforcement of any state statute or administrative rule regarding contracting or procurement would impede any state agency's emergency response that is necessary to protect life or property threatened by this declared disaster, the Governor ordered the suspension of such statutes and rules for the duration of the disaster; and

WHEREAS, the Texas Disaster Act of 1975 (Chapter 418 of the Government Code) authorizes the declaration of a state of disaster if a threat of disaster is imminent; and,

WHEREAS, §418.109 and §418.020 of the Government Code authorize a local government to provide mutual aid assistance in accordance with its policies and procedures and make arrangements necessary to acquire, prepare, or equip sites for temporary housing; and,

WHEREAS, the City has activated its emergency shelter operations and is open to take in people with inadequate shelter; and

WHEREAS, based on statements and information from Homeland Security and Emergency Management personnel and others it is necessary to issue this disaster declaration in order to protect the health, safety, and welfare of our residents and strongly encourage people to stay off icy streets and shelter in place or seek shelter in facilities provided by the City or other local entities and non-profits, and take all cautionary measures to ensure the safety of all persons and animals in their care.

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED BY THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

- By virtue of the authority vested in me by the City Charter, as the presiding officer of the governing body and under Texas Government Code, Section 418.108, I DECLARE a local state of disaster within the City of Austin.
- 2. Pursuant to §418.108(b) of the Government Code, the state of local disaster shall continue for a period of not more than seven (7) days from the date of this declaration unless continued or renewed by the City Council.
- Pursuant to §418.108(c) of the Government Code, this declaration of a local state of disaster shall be given prompt and general publicity and shall be filed promptly with the City Clerk.
- 4. Pursuant to §418.018(d) of the Government Code, this declaration of assistance activates the City's Emergency Management Plan. All other Charter, statutory, and ordinance powers vested in me and all officers of the City of Austin to act in this local state of disaster are activated. This declaration activates the recovery and rehabilitation aspects of all applicable local or interjurisdictional emergency management plans and authorizes the furnishing of all aid and assistance as deemed necessary or desirable by those administering such plans.
- 5. Pursuant to the authority granted under the laws of the State of Texas, the City may take actions necessary to protect the health of persons in the City.
- 6. Pursuant to this authority, residents without adequate shelter are advised to seek emergency shelter. Residents are further advised to bring their animals indoors, not to travel unless necessary because of unsafe road and travel conditions, and to continue monitoring the weather and travel conditions.
- 7. This declaration shall take effect immediately from and after its issuance.

8. The City Clerk is directed to give prompt and general publicity of the issuance of this DECLARATION.
