Authorize negotiation and execution of a cooperative contract with GT Distributors Inc. d/b/a GT Distributors -Austin for rifle resistant hard body armor plates in the amount of \$532,800.

Additional Backup Information:

The City Manager's Office has reviewed this grant for alignment as directed by Resolution 20200611-096 and recommends approval. The contract is for the purchase of 1,776 ProTech DT206C Type III stand-alone rifle resistant hard body armor plates for Austin Police Department (APD) patrol officers and the Counter Assault Strike Team. Body armor plates have a five-year replacement lifecycle due to material degradation, moisture exposure, UV exposure, and wear and tear from daily use. All officers are assigned protective armor for daily use, and many are also issued a rifle vest. These plates are National Institute of Justice compliant, lightweight, and resistant against high velocity rounds.

The Local Government Purchasing Cooperative, administered by Texas Association of School Boards, Inc. (BuyBoard) establishes competitively bid contracts that can be utilized by the State and other government agencies through a cooperative agreement. Cooperative agreements save taxpayer dollars by leveraging the State's volume-buying power to drive down costs on hundreds of contracts through a streamlined cooperative

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purchasing program.

If the City is unable to secure a contract, it may result in the APD losing grant funding to purchase the equipment.
