## Posting Language

Authorize award of a contract with Traffic Logix Corporation to provide dynamic speed display devices, for a term of five years in an amount not to exceed \$616,605.

(Note: This solicitation was reviewed for subcontracting opportunities in accordance with City Code Chapter 2-9D Minority Owned and Women Owned Business Enterprise Procurement Program. For the goods required for this solicitation, there were no subcontracting opportunities; therefore, no subcontracting goals were established).

#### Fiscal Note

Funding in the amount of \$41,107 is available in the Fiscal Year 2021-2022 Operating Budget of the Austin Transportation Department. Funding for the remaining contract term is contingent upon available funding in future budgets.

The Financial Services Department issued an Invitation for Bids (IFB) 2400 BJT1032 for these goods. The solicitation was issued on January 10, 2022, and it closed on February 8, 2022. Of the two offers received, the recommended contractor submitted the lowest responsive offer. ## Additional Backup Information:

The contract is for dynamic speed display devices to improve safety on city streets. These devices display the speeds of vehicles approaching the signs, resulting in lower traveling speeds and improved safety.

This new contract will replace an existing contract, which is set to expire on October 4, 2022. The recommended contractor is the current provider for these goods.

If this contract is not secured, this could have a detrimental effect to the safety of the travelers, as these

devices are integral to reducing the speed of vehicles that exceed the posted speed limits. An inability to secure this contract will also prevent the City from using data collected by these devices to adequately plan and evaluate future transportation safety projects and policies.
