#### Posting Language

Authorize negotiation and execution of a cooperative contract with Insight Public Sector Inc. to provide Public Information Request management software licensing and support services, for a term of five years in an amount not to exceed \$1,100,000.

#### Additional Backup Information:

The contract will continue to provide the Public Information Request (PIR) management software licensing and support services used by designated City staff for purposes of compliance with the Texas Public Information Act (TPIA). The GovQA software supports the City's efforts to streamline and standardize processes associated with changing methodologies and reporting requirements pursuant to the TPIA. In addition, the software is a tool for logging, tracking, and responding to the Freedom of Information Act/TPIA requests and responses, ensures efficient processing of PIRs across the City, identifies PIR responses containing sensitive information, and provides the benefit of publication of PIR related information to the City's open data portal.

The OMNIA Partners cooperative establishes competitively bid contracts that can be utilized by the State and other government agencies through a cooperative agreement. Cooperative agreements save taxpayer dollars by leveraging volume-buying power to drive down costs on hundreds of contracts through a streamlined cooperative purchasing program.
