2	WHEREAS, City Council identified homelessness as the top priority
3	indicator in Austin's Strategic Direction 2023; and
4	WHEREAS, City Council adopted Resolution No. 20180426-030 endorsing
5	the Austin Action Plan to End Homelessness; and
6	WHEREAS, City Council adopted Resolution No. 20190620-184 directing
7	the City Manager to explore a variety of options to address homelessness; and
8	WHEREAS, the Point-In-Time (PIT) count is a count of sheltered and
9	unsheltered persons experiencing homelessness; and
10	WHEREAS, the PIT count aims to provide a snapshot of the individuals
11	and families experiencing homelessness in a geographical area, over the course of
12	one night; and
13	WHEREAS, PIT counts are one of several data sources that help
14	policymakers; and
15	WHEREAS, PIT counts help policymakers and program administrators
16	track progress toward the goal of ending homelessness; and
17	WHEREAS, PIT counts help local communities plan services and programs
18	to appropriately address local needs and measure progress in decreasing
19	homelessness; and
20	WHEREAS, PIT counts help to identify strengths and gaps in a
21	community's current homeless assistance system; and

22	WHEREAS, the PIT count identifies individuals and families residing in
23	unsheltered and sheltered locations such as cars, parks, streets/sidewalks,
24	emergency shelter and transitional housing; and
25	WHEREAS, the PIT count data can be used to secure grant funding; and
26	WHEREAS, the PIT count is an effective tool in determining the number of
27	people experiencing homelessness; and
28	WHEREAS, without adequate coverage in PIT counts of youth and veterans
29	experiencing homelessness, there is a danger they will continue to be underserved;
30	and
31	WHEREAS, the Williamson County Homeless Coalition completed its
32	point-in-time count in early 2022 and counted 24 total persons as unsheltered in all
33	of Williamson County; and
34	WHEREAS, the last PIT count from the Ending Community Homelessness
35	Coalition (ECHO) was done in 2020 and counted 2,506 people experiencing
36	homelessness; and
37	WHEREAS, ECHO has not completed a PIT count for the years 2021 or
38	2022 due to COVID-19 concerns; and
39	WHEREAS, PIT counts rely on hundreds of volunteers to reach as many
40	people as possible; and
41	WHEREAS, Austin service providers are preparing for the upcoming PIT
42	count in January 2023; NOW, THEREFORE,
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46	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN
47	The City Council establishes the formal policy goal of ensuring that future
48	PIT counts are completed at least as often as required by the U.S. Department of
49	Housing and Urban Development for Continuums of Care, including a minimum
50	of every other year.
51	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:
52	The City Manager is directed to help coordinate with ECHO on the PIT
53	count for 2023, including but not limited to recruitment and marketing to the
54	community.
55	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:
56	Following each year that the PIT count is completed the City Manager will
57	proactively ensure that the City Council is briefed with a presentation during a
58	work session.
59	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:
60	The City Council members commit to leveraging their office's resources to
61	recruit additional volunteers for the 2023 upcoming PIT count.
