Posting Language

Authorize negotiation and execution of a cooperative contract with Kinloch Equipment & Supply Inc. to provide original equipment manufacturer parts and repair services for Elgin street sweepers and Vactor sewer cleaners, for a term of three years in an amount not to exceed \$356,000.

(Note: This procurement was reviewed for subcontracting opportunities in accordance with City Code Chapter 2-9C Minority Owned and Women Owned Business Enterprise Procurement Program. For the goods and services required for this procurement, there were no subcontracting opportunities; therefore, no subcontracting goals were established).

Additional Backup Information:

The contract will provide original equipment manufacturer parts and repair services for the City's fleet of Elgin street sweepers and Vactor sewer cleaners on an as-needed basis. The repair parts will be used by Fleet technicians for repairs and preventative maintenance performed at Fleet Service Centers. The repair services will supplement repairs performed by Fleet technicians based on the manufacturers' recommended schedule. This contract will replace a contract which expires September 30, 2022. The requested authorization amounts for this contract were determined using departmental estimates and historical spend. The recommended contractor is the current provider for these goods and services.

The Texas Association of School Boards Inc. (BuyBoard) cooperative establishes competitively bid contracts that can be utilized by the State and other government agencies through a cooperative agreement. Cooperative agreements save taxpayer dollars by leveraging the State's volume-buying power to drive down

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costs on hundreds of contracts through a streamlined cooperative purchasing program. If the City is unable to secure a contract, the City will be forced to procure these parts and services on an asneeded basis, which may result in higher prices and operational costs.
