Additional Backup Information:

The contract will provide the Austin Transportation Department the ability to install city supplied battery backup units (BBUs) at traffic signals within the City. Currently, approximately half of the traffic signals in Austin have BBUs. Last year, the City established a material contract to procure BBUs. Establishing an installation contract will allow staff to concentrate on other more technical projects and deploy BBUs more rapidly. BBUs at traffic signals to continue operating normally for approximately six hours if there is a loss of power at a traffic signal or if power fluctuates. This prevents the signal from going dark during most power outages.
