7	WHEREAS, including materials on a particular topic or expressing a
8	particular opinion does not connote approval or advocacy of that topic or opinion;

10	WHEREAS, book challenges have historically been used to attack the
11	freedom to read a diversity of opinions; and
12	WHEREAS, the American Library Association (ALA) in response to a
13	recent increase and intensity in book banning efforts nationwide issued a statemen
14	that the freedom to read is essential to our democracy; and
15	WHEREAS, the Austin Public Library has a "materials selection policy"
16	process that is fair, deliberative, equitable, and accessible to the public; and
17	WHEREAS, at the January 24, 2022, Austin Library Commission meeting,
18	APL Director Roosevelt Weeks presented a Statement on Book Banning and
19	Library Censorship stating that the public has a "right to read" at the APL; and
20	WHEREAS, to build on the national momentum of the ALA "Freedom to
21	Read" statement, APL joined local bookseller BookPeople to host "Banned
22	Camp," an ongoing series of events designed to promote the freedom to read and
23	the free exchange of ideas; and

25	support the principles expressed by APL and Director Weeks; NOW,
	support the principles expressed by Ai L and Director Weeks, 11011,
26	THEREFORE,
27	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:
28	The Council supports the American Library Association's "Freedom to
29	Read" statement and opposes book banning.
30	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:
31	The Council supports the Austin Library Commission's resolution regarding
32	Austin Public Library's materials selection policy. The Council also supports the
33	Austin Public Library's process for reconsideration and endorses its use for library
34	materials that raise public concern.
