

ORDINANCE NO. 640730-F

"AN ORDINANCE BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN, TEXAS, CALLING AN ELECTION FOR THE AUTHORIZATION OF GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN IN THE FOLLOWING AMOUNTS AND FOR THE FOLLOWING PURPOSES: (1) \$3,500,000 FOR CONSTRUCTING, EQUIPPING, IMPROVING AND REPAIRING HOSPITAL BUILDINGS OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN AND ACQUIRING NECESSARY LANDS THEREFOR; (2) \$750,000 FOR CONSTRUCTING, EQUIPPING AND IMPROVING FIRE STATIONS IN AND FOR THE CITY OF AUSTIN AND ACQUIRING NECESSARY LANDS THEREFOR; (3) \$1,500,000 FOR CONSTRUCTING AND IMPROVING PUBLIC PARKS AND PUBLIC PLAYGROUNDS OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN AND FOR CONSTRUCTING, IMPROVING AND REPAIRING BUILDINGS AND OTHER RECREATION FACILITIES OF SAID PARKS AND PLAYGROUNDS AND FOR ACQUIRING NECESSARY LANDS AND EQUIPMENT THEREFOR; AND (4) \$8,250,000 FOR CONSTRUCTING AND IMPROVING STREETS INCLUDING BRIDGES AND DRAINAGE INCIDENTAL THERETO IN AND FOR SAID CITY OF AUSTIN AND FOR ACQUIRING NECESSARY LANDS THEREFOR; ENACTING PROVISIONS INCIDENT AND RELATING TO THE SUBJECT AND PURPOSE OF THIS ORDINANCE: AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY."

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Austin, Texas, deems it necessary, advisable and to the best interest of the City and its inhabitants that the bonds of said City be issued for the purposes hereinafter stated; and to that end has determined to submit the propositions for the authorization of such bonds to an election as hereinafter set out; and

WHEREAS, the City Council considers that it is to the best interest of the City and its inhabitants that at the earliest possible date the City provide funds for such purposes, thereby creating an emergency measure for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the citizens of the City; now therefore

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

SECTION 1: That an election be held on the fourth Saturday in August, 1964, the same being the 22nd day of August, 1964, which date is not less than fifteen (15) nor more than thirty (30) days from the date of the adoption of this ordinance, at which election the following propositions shall be submitted to the resident qualified electors of said City who own taxable property therein and who have duly rendered the same for taxation:

PROPOSITION NUMBER 1

"SHALL the City Council of the City of Austin, Texas, be authorized to issue THREE MILLION FIVE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$3,500,000) General Obligation Bonds of said City for the purpose of providing funds for permanent public improvements, to-wit: constructing, equipping, improving and repairing hospital buildings of the City of Austin and acquiring necessary lands therefor; said bonds to mature serially over a period of years

not to exceed Thirty (30) years from their date, and to bear interest at a rate not to exceed FIVE PER CENTUM (5%) per annum, payable annually or semi-annually; and to provide for the payment of principal of and interest on said bonds by levying a tax sufficient to pay the annual interest and to create a sinking fund sufficient to redeem said bonds as they become due?"

PROPOSITION NUMBER 2

"SHALL the City Council of the City of Austin, Texas, be authorized to issue SEVEN HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$750,000) General Obligation Bonds of said City for the purpose of providing funds for permanent public improvements, to-wit: constructing, equipping and improving fire stations in and for the City of Austin and acquiring necessary lands therefor; said bonds to mature serially over a period of years not to exceed Thirty (30) years from their date, and to bear interest at a rate not to exceed FIVE PER CENTUM (5%) per annum, payable annually or semi-annually; and to provide for the payment of principal of and interest on said bonds by levying a tax sufficient to pay the annual interest and to create a sinking fund sufficient to redeem said bonds as they become due?"

PROPOSITION NUMBER 3

"SHALL the City Council of the City of Austin, Texas, be authorized to issue ONE MILLION FIVE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$1,500,000) General Obligation Bonds of said City for the purpose of providing funds for permanent public improvements, to-wit: constructing and improving public parks and public playgrounds of the City of Austin and for constructing, improving, and repairing buildings and other recreation facilities of said parks and playgrounds and for acquiring necessary lands and equipment therefor; said bonds to mature serially over a period of years not to exceed Thirty (30) years from their date, and to bear interest at a rate not to exceed FIVE PER CENTUM (5%) per annum, payable annually or semi-annually; and to provide for the payment of principal of and interest on said bonds by levying a tax sufficient to pay the annual interest and to create a sinking fund sufficient to redeem said bonds as they become due?"

PROPOSITION NUMBER 4

"SHALL the City Council of the City of Austin, Texas, be authorized to issue EIGHT MILLION TWO HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$8,250,000) General Obligation Bonds of said City for the purpose of providing funds for permanent public improvements, to-wit: constructing and improving streets including bridges and drainage incidental thereto in and for said City of Austin and for acquiring necessary lands therefor; said bonds to mature serially over a period of years not to exceed Thirty

(30) years from their date, and to bear interest at a rate not to exceed FIVE PER CENTUM (5%) per annum, payable annually or semi-annually; and to provide for the payment of principal of and interest on said bonds by levying a tax sufficient to pay the annual interest and to create a sinking fund sufficient to redeem said bonds as they become due?"

ABSENTEE VOTING shall be conducted at the City Clerk's Office in the City Hall, in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 424, Acts of the 58th Legislature, Regular Session, 1963, and the hours for absentee voting shall be from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

SECTION 2: That the location of the voting boxes in the respective voting precincts and the names of the presiding judge and alternate presiding judge for each shall be as follows:

If at any of the polling places the regularly appointed Presiding Judge is unable to serve at the election, the Alternate Presiding Judge therefor shall serve as Presiding Judge at the polling place. The Presiding Judge of each polling place shall appoint at least two (2) Clerks (one of whom shall be the Alternate Presiding Judge if the election is conducted by the regularly appointed Presiding Judge) and not more than the number shown above for that Precinct of additional clerks as he deems necessary for the proper conduct of the election.

SECTION 3: That said election shall be held under the provisions of and in accordance with the laws governing the issuance of municipal bonds in cities, as provided in the General Laws of the State of Texas, and only resident qualified electors who own taxable property in the City and who have duly rendered the same for taxation shall be qualified to vote.

SECTION 4: That the ballots for said election shall be prepared in sufficient number and in conformity with Chapter 6, V.A.T.C.S., Election Code, as amended, and that printed on such ballots shall appear the following:

PROPOSITION NUMBER 1

"FOR THE ISSUANCE OF \$3,500,000 GENERAL OBLIGATION HOSPITAL BONDS"

"AGAINST THE ISSUANCE OF \$3,500,000 GENERAL OBLIGATION HOSPITAL BONDS"

PROPOSITION NUMBER 2

"FOR THE ISSUANCE OF \$750,000 GENERAL OBLIGATION FIRE STATION BONDS"

"AGAINST THE ISSUANCE OF \$750,000 GENERAL OBLIGATION FIRE STATION BONDS"

PROPOSITION NUMBER 3

"FOR THE ISSUANCE OF \$1,500,000 GENERAL OBLIGATION PARK BONDS"

"AGAINST THE ISSUANCE OF \$1,500,000 GENERAL OBLIGATION PARK BONDS"

PROPOSITION NUMBER 4

"FOR THE ISSUANCE OF \$8,250,000 GENERAL OBLIGATION STREET IMPROVEMENT BONDS"

"AGAINST THE ISSUANCE OF \$8,250,000 GENERAL OBLIGATION STREET IMPROVEMENT BONDS"

AS TO EACH OF THE FOREGOING PROPOSITIONS, the voter shall mark out the statement FOR the proposition or the statement AGAINST the proposition, so that those remaining shall indicate the way he wishes to vote.

SECTION 5: That a copy of this ordinance, signed by the Mayor of the City, attested by the City Clerk, and approved by the City Attorney, shall serve as proper notice of said election.

SECTION 6: That notice of said election shall be given by posting and publication of a copy of this Ordinance, at the top of which shall appear the words "NOTICE OF ELECTION FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS". Said notice shall be posted at the City Hall and at each of the voting places above designated in each of the voting precincts in the City, not less than fourteen (14) full days prior to the date on which said election is to be held, and be published on the same day in each of two successive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Austin, and published in the City of Austin, the first of said publications to be made not less than fourteen (14) full days prior to the date set for said election.

SECTION 7. That the public importance of this measure and the fact that it is to the best interest of the City and its inhabitants to provide funds for the improvements herein contemplated at the earliest possible date for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the citizens of the City of Austin, Texas, constitute an emergency and an imperative public necessity that this Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force immediately upon its passage, all ordinance and Charter rules governing the effective date of any ordinance are hereby suspended and this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force and effect from and after its final passage, and it is so ordained:
