## Exhibit A

This was the corner of the original location of Antone's blues club. Antone's was founded by Clifford Antone, a native of Port Arthur, Texas. Antone's brought the blues to a new generation of Americans. The club brought in musicians who laid the foundation for modern rock and roll and other forms of music, but who in many cases were not getting gigs anymore. At Antone's, these musicians found a home away from home and taught upand-coming young musicians their "old licks" and helped unlock their soul to the blues. Antone's was the national leader in a blues revival that brought this traditional African American form of music to members of every race. Antone's is now located at 231 West 5<sup>th</sup> Street and is still an Austin music institution today.
