SUBJECT: Authorize execution of a construction contract with FAZZONE CONSTRUCTION CO., INC., Cedar Park, TX, for Metz Recreation Center Renovation and Addition in the amount of \$1,151,173 plus a \$114,355 contingency, for a total contract amount not to exceed \$1,265,528.

AMOUNT & SOURCE OF FUNDING: Funding in the amount of \$1,265,528 is available in the Fiscal Year 2004-2005 Capital Budget of the Parks and Recreation Department.

PRIOR COUNCIL ACTION: Ordinance No. 040729-39 vacating 0.439 acres of the 600 Block of Pedernales St. was approved July 29, 2004.

BOARD AND COMMISSION ACTION: Recommended by the Planning Commission and the Urban Transportation Commission.

<u>PURCHASING</u>: Lowest bid of seven received.

MBE / WBE: 12.46% MBE and 2.08% WBE subcontractor participation.

Metz Recreation Center is located in East Austin at 2407 Canterbury Street. The current facility, built in the early 1980's, is unable to meet the needs of the neighborhood because it does not provide adequate space for the programs and functions requested by the community. It is also in need of major maintenance to the roof assembly and HVAC equipment. The building will benefit from the installation of gutters to better protect the exterior walls from water damage and the interior wall surfaces from water penetration. The Parks and Recreation Department and the consultant have worked with the Metz Advisory Board to develop a project, which would better meet the needs of the community and also address required maintenance.

This project will include a new sloped roof and gutter system, new energy efficient HVAC system, major renovation to the interior finishes, new and expanded rest room facilities, a new 1,320 square foot multipurpose room, and reorganization of interior spaces to better accommodate program functions. Austin Energy has provided funding for a new roof-mounted photovoltaic system. A contingency of \$114,355 has been included to allow the expeditious processing of any future change orders, which are common in building renovations due to unforeseen conditions.

The contract allows for 300 calendar days to reach substantial completion of the project. Substantial Completion is scheduled for mid-November 2005.

Bid documents were distributed to 12 general contractors. Bids were opened on November 4, 2004. Fazzone Construction Co., Inc. submitted the lowest of 7 responsive bids received:

THIRD BIDDER – Barth, Inc., Round Rock, TX -\$1,159,632.00 28.80% Non M/WBE prime participation; 0.00% MB; 4.30% MH; 0.00% MN; 0.00% MA; 1.06% WBE; 54.20% Non M/WBE subcontractor participation. Non-Compliant.



Re:	Metz Recreation Center – Renovation and Addition

This construction contract will provide for the renovation and addition of the Metz Recreation Center located at 2407 Canterbury Street. The renovation will address building systems in need of replacement due to age: the roof /gutter system and the HVAC system. The addition will provide for a new 1,320 square foot Multi-Purpose Room for community activities. Included in the work scope will be new and expanded rest room facilities, reorganization of interior spaces to allow better supervision by staff, improved ADA parking and access to the right-of-way on Canterbury Street.

Bids for this project were opened November 4, 2004. Seven (7) responsive bids were received with Fazzone Construction Inc. submitting the low bid. The first four low bidders were deemed non-compliant by the Department of Small and Minority Business Resources. No further reviews were conducted by DSMBR. The major reason for the four bidders being found non-compliant is that the project involves a significant amount of roofing work. Historically we have found that roofing does not lend itself towards subcontracting. For future contracts where roofing is the primary scope of work, goals will be adjusted accordingly.

Project participation achieved by Fazzone Construction, Inc. was: 2.36% African American; 8.10% Hispanic; 0.00% Native American; 0.00% Asian American; 2.08% WBE. Fazzone Construction, Inc. did not meet the goals of the solicitation and they failed to provide substantial Good Faith Efforts documentation as required by City Code, Section 2-9-22 (B) and (E).

However, the interests of the City of Austin and the M/WBE Program would be best served by awarding the construction contract to the low bidder, Fazzone, Construction, Inc., for the following reasons:

- This project bid 58% over the construction estimate due to material price increases and inflation. Going to a higher bidder will make the budget shortfall worse.
- The community has experienced delays due to the recent budget problems of the City. Awarding to the low bidder is in the best interests of the project because it will save rebidding costs and allow us to maintain the current schedule.
- Construction costs appear to be on an escalating trend and the delays associated with rebidding would probably make the situation worse.
