SUBJECT: Authorize negotiation and execution of an agreement with Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) for Federal Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Mobile Source Outreach Assistance grant funding in the amount of \$60,300 for a "Drive Clean, Park Free" project.

AMOUNT & SOURCE OF FUNDING: Funding is available from EPA Mobile Source Outreach Assistance Funding administered by TCEQ. Funding in the amount of \$40,200 in local matching funds for the grant year is available in the 2004-2005 Operating Budgets of the following Departments: \$20,200 from Austin Energy, \$20,000 from Public Works Department.

Austin Energy is requesting authorization to accept a grant from the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) and the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). The grant will provide financial assistance in the amount of \$60,300 to establish a "Drive Clean, Park Free" program. This project encourages smart transportation choices by rewarding consumers who purchase and drive "green" vehicles. When purchasing a vehicle with a favorable EPA ranking, an individual may register to be a Drive Clean, Park Free participant and receive \$100 worth of free parking in the form of a pre-paid parking meter card. The owners of the green vehicles can then park at no cost at any of the 3,700 Cityowned meters in Austin. The project is designed to help shift the balance of downtown traffic from high to low-emission vehicles, reducing air quality impacts from mobile sources.

Vehicles with a favorable ranking on the EPA's Green Vehicle Guide will be eligible for the program. Owners of qualified vehicles may submit a program application after purchasing the vehicle to the City of Austin/Austin Energy Air Quality program. The owners will then receive \$100 worth of free street parking and a bumper sticker identifying their car as a greener vehicle. At the end of the first program year, the City will produce a how-to guide for other communities interested in implementing a similar program.

The total estimated project cost is \$100,500. EPA funds administered by TCEQ will provide up to \$60,300 and the City of Austin will provide the required matching funds of up to \$40,200 in-kind support, including staff time and foregone parking meter revenue.
