Under Article IV, Section 5 of the City Charter, when an initiative petition is certified by the city clerk to be sufficient, the city council shall either (a) pass the initiated ordinance without amendment or (b) order an election and submit the initiated ordinance without amendment to the voters.

This item is on the agenda so that the council may, if the initiative petition is certified by the city clerk to be sufficient, pass an ordinance ordering a special election on the initiated ordinance relating to smoking in public places. The special election would be held in conjunction with the general election for city council Place 1, Place 3, and Place 4 already ordered for May 7, 2005.

As an alternative to ordering an election on the initiated ordinance, the city council may choose to pass the initiated ordinance without amendment.
