AMOUNT & SOURCE OF FUNDING: Funding in the amount of \$169,209 is available from the Texas Department of State Health Services, Refugee Health Screening Program. The grant period is October 1, 2004 through September 30, 2005. This grant funding is included in the Fiscal Year 2004-2005 Health and Human Services Department Approved Operating Budget Special Revenue Fund.

Background

The Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS) allocates federal funds to the Health and Human Services Department for the provision of comprehensive health screening services to newly arriving official refugees. As the local health agency in the area, Austin/Travis County Health and Human Services Department (HHSD) receives \$169,209 annually for this program, which has existed since 1995. All program services are provided with grant funds only.

In early 2004, HHSD requested, and was subsequently granted, an increase of a permanent one-half (0.5) full time equivalent (FTE) position by the granting agency beginning with the grant year October 1, 2004 through September 30, 2005. Services have been provided by temporary personnel. The position provides paraprofessional assistance in the Refugee Health Screening Clinic including assisting with client home visits, assembling medical records and welcome kits, helping the nurse while she gives immunizations, support in Flu clinics, and other miscellaneous duties related to Refugee Clinic operations. It is anticipated that the need will continue to exist for someone to provide these support services. In 2002-2003, 146 clients were served; in 2003-2004, 355 clients; and in the first quarter of 2004-2005, 81 new clients have been served.

The position addresses the Department's Strategic Plan and goals by protecting, preventing, and monitoring the community for preventable diseases by focusing on high-risk populations.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE FISCAL YEAR 2004-2005 HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES DEPARTMENT OPERATING BUDGET OF ORDINANCE NO. 040913-01 TO ADD ONE HALF FULL TIME EQUIVALENT POSITION; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

PART 1. The Council amends the Fiscal Year 2004-2005 Health and Human Services Department Operating Budget of Ordinance No. 040913-01 to add one-half full time equivalent position for the Refugee Health Screening Program for the provision of comprehensive health screening services to newly arriving official refugees.

PART 2. The Council finds that the need to amend the budget constitutes an emergency, a grave public necessity, and an unusual and unforeseen condition that could not, by reasonable diligence, have been included in the original budget for the current fiscal year. Because of this emergency, this ordinance takes effect immediately on its passage for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
