This contract is for the provision of real-time closed captioning services for Austin City Council meetings and "on-call" services for special Council programs and news conferences broadcast on Channel 6. Closed captioning is a written translation of spoken words that scrolls across the television screen as the words are spoken.

Along with television and radio coverage, the live closed captioning process completes the broadcast spectrum of citizen accessibility to Austin City Council meetings. In addition to immediate access by the hearing impaired, the complete closed-captioned transcripts are posted on the City website for citizen access. The transcripts are also downloaded, corrected and archived by the City Clerk's Office as the official City record of the meeting.
