As a result of Hurricane Katrina, evacuations of residents from disaster declared Gulf Coast states (both before and after the storm) resulted in evacuees traveling to and seeking shelter in Austin, Texas. Evacuees who relocated to the State of Texas were temporarily sheltered in the Austin metropolitan area and surrounding counties. As interim housing units have become available, evacuees have been moved into these units. This grant includes the costs of transportation related to move-in, unit rental and utilities. Grant reimbursement will cover 100% of eligible costs. The City of Austin is a sub-grantee for this grant provided by the Federal Emergency Management Agency's Public Assistance Program, through the Texas Department of Public Safety, Governor's Division of Emergency Management. The City of Austin has applied for a second grant to help cover costs related to emergency sheltering operations, which is currently moving through the approval process.
