## RESTRICTIVE COVENANT

Benchmark Plaza, Ltd., a Texas limited partnership
geol West William Cannon Dr., Bldg. 2, Suite 201, Austin, Texas 78749 CONSIDERATION: Ten and No/100 Dollars (\$10.00) and other good and valuable consideration paid by the City of Austin to the Owner, the receipt and suffietency of which is acknowledged.

PROPERTY: A 0.648 acre tract of land, more or less, out of the Thomas Anderson Survey No. 7, in Travis County, the tract of land being more particularly described by metes and bounds in Exhibit "A" attached and incorporated into this covenant; and

WHEREAS, the Owner, whether oite or more, of the Property and the City of Austin have agreed that the Property should betrmpresed with certain covenants and restrictions;

NOW, THEREFORE, it is declared that the Owner of the Property, for the consideration, shall hold, sell and convey the Propend, subject to the following covenants and restrictions impressed upon the Property by thisurestrictive-covenant. These covenants and restrictions shall run with the land, and shall be binding on the Owner of the Property, its heirs, successors, and assigns.

1. If use of the Property as a restaurant use is discontinued for 90 consecutive days, the Owner of the Property will not object ta the City of Austin rezoning the Property to neighborhood commercial (LR) district as-defined in Chapter 25-2 of the City Code. Normal seasonal cessation of a use, er temporary discontinuance for purposes of maintenance or rebuilding of the Property after damage on destruction may not be used in calculating of the period of discontinuance.
2. Hours of operation for a business located on the Property are limited to the hours of 7:00 am. to 11:00 p.m.
3. At the time an application for approval of a site plan is submitted far development of the Property, or any portion of the Property, an Integrated Pest Management (IPM) plan shall be submitted to the Watershed Protection and Development Review Department for review and approval. The IPM plan shall comply with the guidelines in Section 1.6.9.2 (D) and (F) of the Environmental Criteria Manual that age ineffect,on, the date of this covenant.
4. At the time an application for approval of a site plan is submitted for deyeloppent of the Property, or any portion of the Property, a landscape plan shah be submitted to the Watershed Protection and Development Review Department for review add approval. Ninety percent of the total plant material used, exclusive of turf, shall native $t 6$ Central Texas or on the Grow Green Native and Adapted Landscape Plants list, attrichen, as Exhibit "B". Plants on the Invasive Species/Problem Plants list, attached as Exhibit"C",

If, any person or entity shall violate or attempt to violate this agreement and covenant, it shrill be lawful for the City of Austin to prosecute proceedings at law or in equity against such person or entity violating or attempting to violate such agreement or covenant, to prevent the person or entity from such actions, and to collect damages for such actions.

If any part of this agreement or covenant is declared invalid, by judgment or court order, the same shall in no way affect any of the other provisions of this agreement, and such remaining portion of this agreement shall remain in full effect.
7. If at any time flee City of Austin fails to enforce this agreement, whether or not any violations of if are knolvn, such failure shall not constitute a waiver or estoppel of the righto enforce it.
8. This agreement may be modified, amended, or terminated only by joint action of both (a) a majority of the members of the City Council of the City of Austin, and (b) by the owners) of the Property subject to the modification, amendment or termination at the time of such modification, adnendment or termination.
