What is Austin Youth Council?



Previous AYC monthly meeting

Members meet once a month and discuss issues concerning youth as well as listen to presentations from City staff and outside organizations in the city. The council is structured a AYC is made up of over 65 high school students across Austin representing the youth population of Austin including students from AISD, DVISD, RRISD, PfISD, LISD, Charter Schools, Parochial Schools, Private Schools, and homeschooled students.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT

Elected members and districts

AYC members serve within their local districts led by *elected members* who mirror Austin city council members. Districts meet to contribute to their schools & local communities.

COMMUNITY SERVICE

Every month AYC members are expected to participate in 3 hours of community service collectively. Those unable to attend are expected to submit hours individually.

CIVIC ENGAGEMENT

Committees & committee chairs

AYC members join committees that are focused on current issues that impact youth led by committee chairs. AYC's continuing committees for next year:

- Education
- Environmental
- Participatory budgeting
- School-to-prison pipeline
- Youth mental health

NATIONAL LEAGUE OF CITIES

National League of Cities hosts two annual conference: City Summit (held in a member-city every Fall) and Congressional Cities conference (held in Washington, D.C. in Spring.

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Requirements & benefits

All interested high school schools must have a designated adult sponsor (teacher, counselor, staff, principal) committed to attending some of the monthly meetings and be responsible for checking in with AYC representatives between meetings.

HIGH SCHOOLS MAY NOT HAVE MORE THAN FOUR STUDENT REPRESENTATIVES

All schools will need to complete a school form that both the principal and sponsor sign to acknowledge their school's commitment.

AYC MEMBERS WILL:

- Learn and practice Robert's Rules of Order
- Practice civic engagement
- Develop communication and social interaction skills
- Engage with like-minded peers throughout the city
- Network with City of Austin departments, organizations and local businesses

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Principal & sponsor participation

- Approves school's participation in all AYC events
- Appoints a sponsor to represent school and students
- Assist sponsor in selecting students to participate in AYC
- Attend monthly meetings (as available)
- Select students who meet/exceed minimum included in packet requirements to participate in AYC**
- Check-in with students to assist and ensure each are fulfilling tasks, goals & expectations regarding AYC
- Commit to serving in one school year (August-May)
- Submit completed application
- 2.5 GPA or higher
- Attend & actively participate in monthly meetings
- Participate in monthly community service+
- Discuss issues and solutions surrounding youth in Austin
