
# **Overview**

- 25 gates
- 126 daily flights
- Designed to serve 11 million annual passengers

#### 2019 expansion


- \$350 million budget

- 9 new gates Total 34 gates
- Designed to serve 15 million annual passengers
- 2022 Growth
  - 21.1 million annual passengers served
  - Designed to serve 15 million annual passengers


