CONSTRUCTION TRAINING PROGRAM

ABOUT:

Directed by Council Resolution No. 20180628-061, the City of Austin implemented the Construction Training Program:

• Intended to train and develop a pool of qualified and ready to work, skilled and semi-skilled laborers on City construction projects and promote local economic opportunities by building a pipeline of construction workers.

Participation in the Construction Training Program (CTP) is now required for all City construction projects with a budget of \$500K or more as outlined in Section 00840 of the contract.

THE PROGRAM:

CTP trainee requirements are based on the project budget and range between 2-6 participants for budgets between \$500K-\$10M and 15% of the entire workforce for those budgeted over \$10M.

PROCESS SUMMARY:

- 1. The General Contractor (GC) is responsible for meeting the CTP requirements, but can require their Subcontractors to assume all, or part, of the requirement.
- 2. The cost associated with meeting the CTP requirements should be included in the GC's bid/proposal.
- 3. Depending on project budget and type, there are multiple ways CTP requirements can be met including:
 - Determine if current employees are enrolled, or a graduate of a DOL Training Programs:
 - DOL-Registered Apprenticeship Program (for Vertical Projects)
 - DOL-Approved OJT Program (for Horizontal Projects)
 - DOL-Certified Bilingual Training Program (for Vertical and Horizontal Projects)
 - Select participants currently enrolled in one of the above programs
 - Enroll current employees in one of the above programs
 - Augmenting current staff with personnel from the Pipeline Organizations
 - Upskilling current employees with training provided by the Pipeline Organizations
- 4. The initial Training Plan detailing how the GC intends to satisfy the CTP requirements is due prior to receipt of NTP.
- 5. Training Reports outlining the total number of hours worked by each trainee is required to be submitted monthly by the GC.
- 6. A lack of demonstrated reasonable effort to comply with the CTP will reflect in the GC's Contractor Performance Evaluation and may impact future business opportunities with the City of Austin.
