## BURNET ROAD TREE WATERING PROJECT Tree Care

**2015 AWARD** \$1,500

#### **IMPACT**

86 non-irrigated trees, planted along the right-of-way, were hand watered during the summer months. Tree were planted during a different phase of the project along Burnet Road from 2222 to Highway 183. Costs included landscape fabric, trunk guards, mulch. Watering was conducted by volunteers and paid staff.

#### **IMPACT**



#### **IMPACT**


This project focused on seven areas around Lady Bird Lake that required pruning in live oak groves. Extensive root grown cleaning and structural pruning was required.

## SHIPE PARK\_BALL MOSS REMOVAL Tree Care

**2017 AWARD** 

\$5,500

#### **IMPACT**

This project removed 90% of the ball moss from 9 trees located at Shipe Park. Additionally, small and necessary pruning cuts were completed to bring the trees back to health.

## SHADE TREE PRUNING BETWEEN BRIDGES Tree Care
