Eligibility

Visual artists who live and work in the Austin metropolitan area are eligible (seven county). **Only one proposal per artist or artist team**. Artists may *not* apply as both an individual and as a team member on separate projects.

Incomplete or late applications will be disqualified.

Eligible to apply:

- Artists currently under contract
- temporary City of Austin employees

Ineligible to apply:

- Full-time, permanent City of Austin employees
- Artist or artist teams who have received two previous TEMPO commissions, either as an individual or team
- Employees of the Economic Development, Parks and Recreation,
 Austin Animal Center and Austin Public Library Departments

SPECIFICS

- One artwork will be selected for each Council District. Artists must be flexible regarding location.
- District 3 will be the location for the TEMPO 2018 temporary art festival in November for East Austin Studio Tour.
- Artwork sites are limited to a list of pre-selected parkland, recreation centers, and libraries.
- All artworks must be up for full exhibition period (September, October and November)
- By end of November, all artworks to be removed, site restored and contracts closed.

Submission Requirements

Narrative

During the month of October, when National Hispanic Heritage month is celebrated, and through November, as part of the East Austin Studio Tour, park goers and art patrons able will discover a group of massive piñatas casually geazing along the shores of Town Lake in Austin's east-side. The iconic burros will provide a splash of color against the green backdrop of Edward Rendom Sr. Park.


The scene is playful, but the message is serious: Austin's growth story cannot avoid the demolition of cherished sites, but the city must grow along a path of creative destruction, where a sense of place and identity can be found and celebrated from within the community of Austin's eastside. The pulata embodies the spirit of creative destruction.

We intend to place the piñata display along the trail where large oak trees can be used to shade the installation. Whether enjoying a picnic in the park, a run on the trail, or a day on the water, the installation will serve as a reminder of the resiliency of the eastside community.

Advanced digital fabrication techniques will be used to design the interior skeleton of the piñatas so that different poses can be modeled for each burro to engage with the landscape and create a more playful effect. Water-resistant materials will be used to fabricate the external shell and omamentation to ensure the project's durability during the installation period.




Site map location






