The City of Austin would like your feedback.

On February 1, 2018, City Council passed a resolution in opposition to the Executive Order 13767, related to the construction of a wall on the U.S.- Mexico border, directing the City Manager to initiate the following actions:

- Study and review the economic and other effects any physical border wall may have on the city of Austin;
- Consult in the development of the policy options with other localities that are exploring or have established similar financial policies related to the proposed border wall, including, but not limited to Tucson, Arizona, and San Diego, California; and,
- Develop a policy requiring every entity that seeks to do business with the City of Austin to disclose itself, any parent company and subsidiaries, any bids submitted or contract awarded, related to the design, construction, or financing of the proposed border wall, with consideration to legally permissible options and all relevant operational impact to City departments.

As our partners in Capital Improvement Program delivery, it is important to receive your input on the development of a disclosure policy. Your feedback will inform staff's policy development and will be shared with Council.

To that end, we have scheduled two input sessions in November. Both sessions will be held at 721 Barton Springs Road at the Town Lake Center (TLC), Assembly Room 130. Parking is available at the Palmer Events Center and will be validated. The dates and times are as follows:
