Did you know space heaters cause one-third of home heating fires and are the second
leading cause of home fires after cooking? Stay prepared this winter with these safety
tips when using heaters:

- Make sure your heater has an automatic shut-off, in case it tips over.
- Keep a metal or heat-tempered screen in front of your fireplace.
- Move objects at least 3 feet away from a fireplace, wood stove, or space heater.







Be emergency prepared and stay weather aware for many different situations and hazards! The highest threats for Central Texas are flash flooding, wildfires, hail, and tornadoes.





- Check if a Burn Ban is in effect. Dry conditions can lead to fires starting easily.
- Clean gutters and other debris from around your home and yard.
- Find an outdoor water source with a hose that can reach any area of your property.
- Make digital copies of important documents and keep them in a secure location


When thunder roars, go indoors! If you can hear thunder, you are close enough to be struck by lightning! It is important to immediately find a safe and enclosed shelter to protect yourself from the weather.

Fun fact: There are approximately 25 million lighting strikes per year. *Bonus fun fact* is lighting is hotter than the surface of the Sun and can reach temperatures around 50,000 degrees Fahrenheit.



- Discuss and create a plan for what to do in emergencies and evacuations.
- Monitor local news and social media for updates as weather changes.
- Have emergency supplies in place at home, at work, and in the car.
- If you approach a flooded road or path remember: Turn Around, Don't Drown!



• Check the 4 P's when it drops below freezing — People, Pets, Plants, and Pipes.

Christmas Day

- Be careful of ice on overpasses/elevated areas when driving in freezing conditions.
- If possible, stay off roads when they are iced over. If trapped in your car, stay inside.
- Practice proper hygiene to make sure you don't spread the Flu or other illnesses.
