It is composed of three (3) phases: Identify phase -Identify opportunities for performance improvement through a needs assessment completed in the form of a chart review and use it to formulate a performance improvement (PI) plan. Implement phase- Complete activities based upon your performance improvement the lessons learned into your practice. Integrate phase- Assess your progress and determine the degree to which you have integrated your learning experiences through a second chart review.
