

MARTIN LUTHER KING JR. BLVD / FM 969

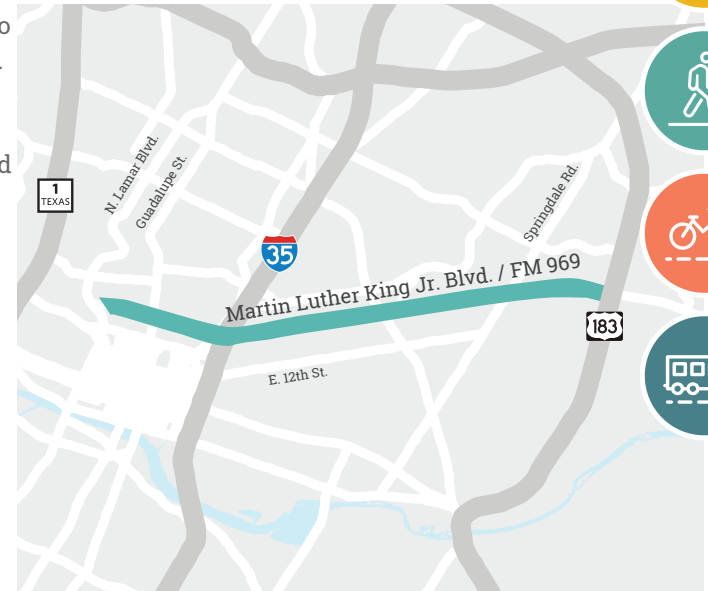


As part of the Corridor Mobility Program, the City of Austin is working closely with the community to develop a Corridor Mobility Plan—or preliminary engineering report—for Martin Luther King Jr. Blvd. / FM 969. The goal of the Martin Luther King Jr. Blvd. / FM 969 Corridor Mobility Plan is to improve safety, mobility, and connectivity for all users—whether you drive, walk, bike or take transit. The Martin Luther King Jr. Blvd. / FM 969 Corridor Mobility Plan will begin at North Lamar Boulevard and continue east to U.S. 183.

WHAT IS A CORRIDOR MOBILITY PLAN?

The Martin Luther King Jr. Blvd. / FM 969 Corridor Mobility Plan will recommend improvements that may include:

- Intersection improvements (signals, turn lanes, pedestrian crossings)
- Bicycle facilities (separated and protected bike lanes)
- Sidewalks and curb ramps (accessibility, crosswalks)
- Transit-supportive improvements (connectivity to bus stops, transit priority signalization)
- Complete streets (improvements along corridor segments that accommodate all modes of transportation, streetscape improvements)
