Outdoor Music Venue Permit Information

Investigation

The Music Office is required under Austin City Code of Ordinances Section 9-2-50 (Music Office Review) in Chapter 9-2 of the sound ordinance to conduct an appropriate level evaluation, based on the type of permit being requested and the potential impact to the surrounding community. This investigation may include on-site inspections including sound measurements, discussions with nearby residents and business owners, and any additional research relevant to assessing potential impacts. A Sound Impact Plan (SIP) is then written by the Music Office based on the findings of the investigation.

Timeline

Per City Code, the Music Office is to receive an application from the DAC within three business days of submittal. The Music Office will conduct an appropriate level investigation, prepare a report recommending approval or denial of the application with any appropriate conditions and restrictions, and return it to the Development Services Department (DSD). The final determination will be made by DSD no later than 45 days after the application is submitted.

Entertainment District Allowances

- Warehouse or Sixth Street Entertainment: Sound equipment may be operated up to 85 decibels between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 2:00 a.m., unless a more restrictive decibel limit is set forth in the Sound Impact Plan.
- Outside either district: Sound equipment may be operated up to 85 decibels or up to 70 decibels at a restaurant general (51% food sales), unless a more restrictive decibel limit is set forth in the Sound Impact Plan. Sound equipment may be operated between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and:
 1. 10:30 p.m. Sunday through Wednesday
 2. 11:00 p.m. Thursday
 3. 12:00 midnight Friday or Saturday
- Outside either district and within 600 feet of a property with residential zoning & use: Sound equipment may be operated up to 85 decibels or up to 70 decibels at a restaurant general (51% food sales), unless a more restrictive decibel limit is set forth in the Sound Impact Plan. Sound equipment may be operated between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and:
 1. 8:00 p.m. Sunday through Thursday (extension to 10:00 p.m. possible with Music Office approval)
 2. 10:00 p.m. Friday and Saturday (extension to midnight possible with Music Office approval)

Revocation of Permit

As stated in City Code Section 9-2-65 (Revocation of Live Music Permit), the Music Office may recommend that a permit be revoked for repeatedly exceeding the allowable decibel limits, hours of permitted sound amplification, or for other violations of conditions set forth in the Sound Impact Plan. The permit expires at midnight on the first anniversary of the date it was issued. It is the applicant's responsibility to apply for permit renewal prior to expiration. The accountable official may refuse to issue or renew an outdoor music venue permit if the permittee has been convicted of more than two permit violations under Chapter 9-2, or if the property where the sound equipment will be used has received more than two permit violations.
