**Austin Community College - 43rd Annual Student Exhibit**

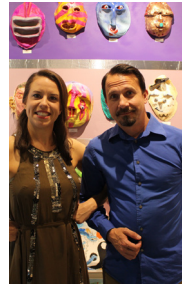

Exhibit: Feb. 2 - Mar. 17, 2019

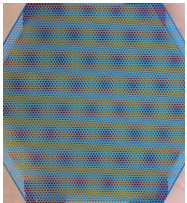
Kaiser creates prints representing a historical foundation and a respect for family and ancestors who make us and who shape us into what we are today.

**Mae - Psycho-geography of Austin: Devolution of a Sky**

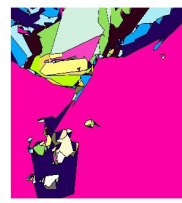

Smith's paintings express the surreal energy of tension in the human figure and depict body movements that are often unseen or unnoticed.

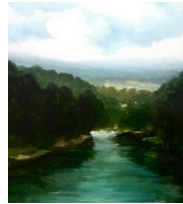


**Peter Shen - Eye On Lens**

DAC staff inspires generations of future artists by being examples of passionate creators and bringing their talents and encouragement into the classroom.

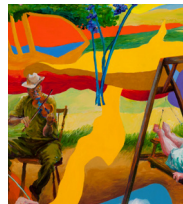


**Vy Ngo - The In Between**
