PROJECT INFORMATION

The Emma S. Barrientos Mexican American Cultural Center (ESB-MACC) Phase 2 of the 2018 Facility Expansion Plan approved by Austin City Council will meet the growing needs of the community. Construction will start in early 2023 and continue into early 2025. The original expansion plan was approved in 2000; Phase 1 was completed in 2007; and Phase 1A was completed in 2010.

The completed project will support programs which foster meaningful understanding and appreciation of Mexican American, Native American, Chicano and other Latinx Cultures. The new addition shall pay homage to the late renowned Mexican design architect, Teodoro González de León, who designed the current facility.

Phase 2 features:

- Additional 19,000 square feet and renovation of 8,600 existing square feet
- New space for music rehearsal, performance, art exhibitions, support teams, storage, culinary instruction, landscaping and community gathering
- Enhanced features such as rooms with natural light, flexible controlled perimeter of the zocalo and shade structure
- Wayfinding signage
- This will be the first PARD facility to connect to Austin Energy's District Cooling network
- New Art in Public Places opportunities for local artist
