

The ESB MACC programs and special events foster a meaningful understanding and appreciation of not only Mexican American but also Native American, Chicano, and other Latino cultures. The programs and education curriculum include the areas of visual art, theatre, dance, literature, music, multi-media, and the culinary arts.



SIGNATURE EVENTS

The ESB MACC offers annual cultural celebrations that are free and open for anyone to attend. No need to register! Just check our website and social media for event details.

VIVA MEXICO Celebrate Mexican Independence Day on or around Sept 16 with the ESB MACC. Activities and performances celebrate a wide variety of Latin American traditions including folk art mercados and live performances of ballet folklorico, mariachi, and cumbia/ tejano music. Local community groups often participate to offer cultural arts activities. This celebration often includes a traditional "grito" or call to independence.

DAY OF THE DEAD or Dia de Los Muertos/ Dia de Muertos is a recognition that all living beings belong to a great cycle of life and death. Celebrated on or around Nov 1-2, it is a time of year to reflect on those we've lost and honor their lives with beautiful altars and rich foods. It is a celebration of ancestry, of familiar traditions, and the interconnectedness between both the living and those who have passed away. It is traditionally a spiritual celebration and a time to bond with family and friends.

MUJER A celebration of women in the arts. This Springtime festival is often associated with women's history month, particularly with Latina/e/x women whose accomplishments may often be underrepresented in mainstream culture. La Mujer offers an opportunity to present theater, dance, music, and women-focused workshops that lift women up, connect them to resources and to each other. AustinTexas.gov/MACCLaMujer
