History and Mission

- The Millennium Youth Entertainment Complex (MYEC or Millennium) was constructed in 1999 on the former site of the Rosewood Shopping Center in East Austin. A collaboration between the City of Austin, HUD, and the Austin Rosewood Community Development Corporation, the Millennium was created to provide a safe, recreational environment for local youth.
- Community leaders and citizens (deemed Promise Keepers) worked diligently to contribute to the project and have continued to promote its existence as a staple in the Rosewood District. The Millennium is dedicated to the memories of Tamika Ross (1976–1992) and Juan Cotera (1973–1996). While their deaths served as an inspiration for the creation of the building, today their spirits represent hope for the future and the promise of peace in the surrounding community.
- The mission of the MYEC is to provide a safe, secure, and comfortable environment (free from drugs, gangs, crime, and violence) where families can enjoy a wide range of affordable, high-quality recreational and entertainment activities and attractions.

Comments: Initial Themes

- Fond memories as a child/memories with their children
- **Keep original purpose** but needs upgrading and a suggestion to expand the purpose, but the original should be a part of the purpose
- Keep it affordable
- Upgrades/Renovations/Technology improvements needed one of the most mentioned

comments

- Lots of comments about skating, especially the underground Roller disco
- Aging infrastructure specifically the video games
- More outreach, marketing about the use of Millennium needs to be done to increase numbers - this was mentioned a lot
- Number of days open; always closed (perception of the space)
- **Questions around management** some suggested the City of Austin should manage directly, some indicated a new third party needs to be hired, and some suggested the City hire the ASM staff and manage directly.
