Public Engagement Report 2023-2024



OVERVIEW


In May 2023, Waterloo Greenway (WG) and the City of Austin Parks and Recreation Department (PARD)

relaunched the design process for the historic Sir Swante Palm Neighborhood Park. As part of the design phase, a new engagement process was initiated that would build upon previous data collected from a robust in-person and virtual community engagement process in 2016. The goal of this new engagement plan was to: (1) inform the public the design process for Palm Park was relaunching; (2) determine whether park features recommended by the community in 2016 were still relevant today; and (3) capture new information that could inform the design process.

Over the course of eleven months, Cortez Consulting, in partnerships with Waterloo Greenway and the City of Austin Parks and Recreation Department, gathered quantitative and qualitative data through a variety of community engagement strategies. The timeline for the process was



divided into **three (3) distinct phases**, and when speaking with the public, we emphasized where we were in the project timeline and how their feedback would inform the design.



Along with a phased approach, the project team was intentional about the range of strategies incorporated to involve participants. We were thoughtful in reaching out to key Latino leaders in East Austin, involving Palm School Alumni, coordinating meetings at locations and times that were accessible for a range of schedules, inviting key stakeholders such as Travis County, and providing ample time to inform the public of meeting dates. To further ensure participation, we hosted bilingual meetings providing information in Spanish/English and fulfilling requests to offer ASL services for the hearing impaired. Our communication with participants was extensive. While participants were not required to register for community meetings, if they did, a confirmation email was sent when they registered, a reminder email was sent the day before meetings, and an optional text message was sent 8-hours in advance of meetings. We also provided various options for community members to contact the project team regarding meetings. To bridge the digital divide, we also provided a general phone number where residents could reach us for project or meeting information. Overall, we believe the community engagement plan set forth to execute public involvement for the relaunch of Palm Park was thorough. The following summary report provides a detailed look into the campaign, the strategies, and the data gathered throughout this process.

PHASE I: GROUNDING & PROJECT KICK-OFF

The project team kicked-off engagement by coordinating two Gallery Walk Open Houses in August 2023. The purpose of these community gatherings was to create an informal environment for families to become reacquainted with the project, meet the design team, and provide feedback. During the meeting, community members had an opportunity to:

- Speak directly with project & design team members,
- Interact with the Palm Park Model and provide ideas/feedback,
- View top park features identified in 2016 and provide comments/ideas through a Pinterest Activity,
- Submit feedback through general comment cards, and
- Complete a demographic survey where they could provide further information.









The meetings were hosted at a well-known community space and restaurant in East Austin, Juan in A Million. Community members could drop-in over a period of two-hours and enjoy free food as well as participate in activities. One meeting was held on Thursday evening and the other was held on Saturday morning. The flyers below were created to market the event to the public throughout the months of July and August.





Along with flyers, we promoted the Gallery Walk Open House through a formal press release distributed by both the City of Austin and Waterloo Greenway, paid media ads, numerous social media posts, and by tabling and presenting at local community meetings. Waterloo Greenway also launched a dedicated webpage for the public to learn more about the project and promote friendly reminders and sign-up links for all project meetings. Below reflects a snapshot of the dedicated webpage and social media promotion that took place during Phase I.





PHASE I: RESULTS

A goal of Phase I was to reintroduce the public to Palm Park. As such, we designed Palm Park Fact Sheets (Appendix), that were distributed at all meetings and events. These fact sheets provided a snapshot view of the history of Palm Park since 1933, and reflected data collected in 2016 regarding the best assets, top features, and most important amenities the public wanted to see reflected at Palm Park. In addition to the fact sheets, we hosted "Community Engagement & History" stations at every meeting so the public could be informed of all efforts that had taken place since the project started. We were intentional in staffing this station with team members who had a strong history of the project and could answer complex questions the public might have about the project.



Along with informing the public of the history of Palm Park, we wanted to gather data on the type of imagery they felt best represented the future of the park. Similar to the program, Pinterest, community members could pin pictures they liked and place them into categories. The categories were created by taking the top park features identified by community members through the 2016 engagement process.

The categories were:

- History & Storytelling
- Places to Gather
- Shade Trees
- Places for Relaxation
- Play Elements
- Shade Structures

The public could sort from a variety of photos and select the photo they felt best represented each category. Along with identifying their top choices, they could leave comments as to why they felt this image was their top choice. In the end, we were able to identify the **top two (2) images** that resonated with the public per each category. This data allowed the team to narrow down the types of amenities the public envisioned at Palm Park. The information collected during our Gallery Open Houses was shared with the design team and all data from

participants can be found in the Appendix. In total, we had **69 community members** participate in our Gallery Walk Open Houses.

PHASE I: LESSONS LEARNED

During the relaunch of engagement for Palm Park, we found some community members continued to feel strongly about the loss of Palm Park Pool. In 2014, the City of Austin Parks and Recreation Department conducted an Aquatics Facilities Needs Assessment and determined Palm Park Pool would be closed indefinitely. Along with decommissioning the pool, the remaining structural elements of the pool were demolished in 2023, causing further pain and frustration. While members of this project team cannot change the decisions of past events, we acknowledge the closure of Palm Park Pool remains a traumatic pain point for some community members, and it was felt throughout this process. As such, we observed that there were key Latino leaders who were hesitant about



trusting this new process and felt strongly about ensuring the history of Palm Park would be preserved and integrated into the new design. Comments we received often reflected the type of activities that used to take place in the park, particularly as it relates to the lived experiences of Mexican American families. We also received comments and ideas of ways we could preserve the memory of the pool, especially for children and families who have long resided in East Austin or were Palm School alumni. We acknowledge that the land that holds space for Palm School and Palm Park, including the pool, represents a profound historic memory for Latinos residing in East Austin. We were intentional throughout this engagement process of asking for ways we could honor the past, while planning for the future, and the work continues. We continue to work in restoring trust and reassuring these community members that we heard their frustrations and will do our best to ensure the history of Palm Park is reflected in the new design.

In addition to these lessons, we also experienced a profound excitement from an array of community members who were invested in the future of Palm Park. We had participants from a wide range of ages involved, and it was exciting to see children envision new ways the park could be designed. We did our best to include families and children, and we'll discuss some of the activities we developed to gather their feedback further in the report. Ultimately, this engagement process brought new insights and expanded the project team's appreciation of building an inclusive, family-friendly park for all Austinites.

VIRTUAL & PAPER SURVEY

In our efforts to expand the public's involvement, we created both a **virtual and paper survey** that replicated our feedback activities during Phase I & Phase II. The surveys were available for **nine-weeks (9)** beginning on September 13 and closed on November 20.

The team promoted the virtual survey via the Palm Park project website, e-newsletter, social media and during in-person outreach through flyers with a QR Code survey. The surveys were available in Spanish and English with unique links shared during promotion to make it easy to access for Spanish-speakers. The design of the survey was user-friendly, with engaging visuals and check-box options for ease of completion. The virtual data reflected no incomplete surveys, and several comments were submitted thanking the project team for the ability to provide feedback online. Core to the survey was the ability for the public to rank their preferences based on images from the seven themes: (1) History & Storytelling, (2) Places for Relaxation, (3) Place to Gather, (4) Play Elements, (5) Shade Structures, (6) Shade Trees, and (7) Water Features. To encourage participation, we provided the option for participants to share their contact information to be entered into a raffle. Raffle prize winners were selected by a random online drawing and winners were notified by phone/email. In total, 54 community members participated in the virtual survey. The intention of the virtual survey was to allow the public the flexibility to share their feedback without having to physically attend an event.

Community members also had the option to complete a **paper survey** during in-person community meetings. The project team dedicated time during meetings for members to complete surveys. We stressed the importance of having private time to share feedback and rank images. For both surveys, we also gathered demographic information and asked whether they were Palm School Alumni. We had **39 paper surveys** submitted for a **total of 93** completed surveys with 10% being Palm School Alumni.

SURVEY HIGHLIGHTS

An important data point we collected through the surveys was participants' area of residence. This information would reflect whether participants lived in close proximity to the park or were familiar with Palm Park. Our results showed the majority of participants resided in Central East Austin, zip code (78702), also known as Austin City Council District 3. The next highest representation came from Southeast Austin, zip code (78747) and Austin City Council District 2. We learned in speaking with participants that many families that used to reside in Central East Austin had moved to Southeast Austin. We had several families share that they used to own homes in Central Austin but with the increased costs of living they moved South. These families also had siblings or parents who attended the original Palm School and were grateful we were seeking their input. Here are some quotes we heard from participants during our meetings:

"My brother went to Palm School, but he had to work tonight and ask if I could attend in his place."

"My mom went to Palm School, and now my kids attend Palm School in Southeast Austin."

"I went to Palm School and I'm here tonight to share my experiences. I'm glad you're doing this."

Below is a word cloud of the data collected on the top three (3) zip codes:





SURVEY DEMOGRAPHICS

Through the surveys we also learned about the demographics of our participants. The data reflected that we had diverse representation regarding race/ethnicity as well as identity. Given the historical context of Palm Park, we were pleased to see that 34% of survey participants identified as Hispanic or Latinx. This mirrors the current Latino population in Austin and felt the survey sample was strong. We also had participants who identified as multiracial and LGBTQIA+. The graphics below provide a snapshot of the participant demographics for our virtual and paper survey.





SURVEY FINDINGS

The purpose of the survey was to gather consistent data across the project, whether families participated online or in-person. We continued to use imagery as a means for the community to identify what they felt most represented their ideas for Palm Park. The most interesting result is that the 93 survey participants selected the **exact same images** for each category (except one) as our **1,055 other participants** who voted in-person and attended different events. This leads us to conclude that, in general, **the public agreed** on the types of images they felt would best be represented in Palm Park. The graphics below show this comparison.

As shown above, the only category where the survey differed was in the image for **Shade Trees**. The image that spoke most to participants who took the virtual/paper survey was the **bench shade**; whereas **lawn shade** was the top voice for votes collected at other events. Despite the differences, it seems both elements can be featured at the park given the goal by the design team is to preserve as many trees as possible and provide natural shade.

PHASE II: ENVISIONING PALM PARK

OUTREACH

During the months of September–November 2023, we launched a comprehensive outreach campaign to engage community members in our next phase of the project. Prior to designing our outreach plan, we met with the staff at Waterloo Greenway and PARD to discuss their vision for the type of outreach that would work best. The entire team agreed pop-up community events, school presentations, tabling, block walking, and general grassroots outreach would be most effective in garnering participation. We specifically focused our efforts in Central and East Austin and worked with non-profit organizations that supported parks projects. We sent emails to the following organizations sharing updates on the project and inviting them to join our meetings: Go Austin!

(GAVA), East Cesar Chavez Neighborhood Association, Dove Springs Proud, Dove Spring Recreation Center Advisory Board, Travis County, PODER, Mexican American Cultural Center (MACC), Austin Parks Foundation, Festival Beach Food Forest, Fruitful Commons, Downtown Austin Alliance, Red Line Parkway, Tejano y Mas ATX, Save Palm School (Paul Saldaña/Martha Cotera), and Palm School Alum (Marcos de Leon/Ana Maciel). We also reached out to faith-based organizations and specifically hosted a meeting for Austin Interfaith during Phase II.

Our team tabled at local community events such as: Hot Sauce Festival, Fiestas Patrias, AISD Back to School Showcase, Boo the Flu, Trail-or-Treat, a Pop-Up Drop-In at Cenote, and several events at Waterloo Park. During these events, we promoted the upcoming Palm Park Community Conversations, shared a broader understanding of the project, gathered input and collected contact information. These local community events were traditionally held on weekends, evenings, and attended by a diverse makeup of Austin residents. To ensure consistent data, participation numbers were only collected for individuals who directly spoke with the engagement team about the project or provided their contact information for future communication. Data gathered during Community Tabling Events was incorporated into the project feedback forms and shared with the Project Team on an on-going basis. We also coordinated a multi-day block walk campaign distributing door hangers (Appendix) to 500 homes in East Austin. The team specifically focused on neighborhoods around

Sanchez Elementary, Martin Middle School, and Mendez Recreation Center. Block Walkers shared meeting information with residents who were home or left door hangers for residents who were not home. The following table reflects the types of events we organized and/or attended as well as contacts we made during these engagements.

Engaging the school community was another important strategy we incorporated in this phase of the project. We participated in the Eastside Community School Alliance coordinated by Austin Voices and held monthly for community partner organizations. In these meetings our team helped to share the information on Palm Park and distributed flyers to attending partners. We also provided Community Presentations at school events such as

"Coffee with the Principal" at the new Palm Elementary School. These presentations were attended by parents of the school who were primarily Spanish-speakers and were interested in community information.

One of our most successful outreach events was a **Pop-Up Event** held at Waterloo Greenway's Annual Creek Show. Over a one-week period from November 10–18, the team setup the Palm Park Model and designed the same voting activity as we had for all other community meetings. Over a four-hour period each evening, the team would speak with a diverse group of families about the project and gather their input. During this activity, we saw over 1,000 people and gathered their insights on the top park features. A full report of the community feedback received during this event is found in the Appendix, a sample below shows how votes were tallied. Overall, we incorporated an engagement strategy that was multifaceted and shared information at an array of events and meetings.






PHASE II: PROMOTION

Like Phase I, we created a strong promotional campaign to spread the word. A Facebook event page was designed with meeting information and directed community members to our sign-up page. City Council Members were informed of our meetings as well as and encouraged to share with their email listsery. Our team also created a social media toolkit, with recommendations for posting dates and graphics. A new flyer was designed, along with a QR Code for easy access to sign-up. Information was provided in Spanish and English, and samples can be found below. A copy of the **social media toolkit** and flyers can be found in Appendix.










While community members were not required to sign-up, we created a Google form to help us communicate with participants who were interested in attending the meetings. This form allowed us to collect information such as needs for translation services, food restrictions, and contact information to communicate ahead of meetings. It was our intention to establish a relationship with participants early on and provide them with as much information to easily attend our meeting. We sent confirmation emails when participants signed up, reminders the week of the event, and option text messages the day of the event (if participants requested). We also sent maps with parking details as well as important updates regarding room locations and times. Overall, we believe this sign-up process was an effective form of engagement during Phase II and participants shared with our team how helpful this process was in preparing for meetings. Below is an example of the sign-up form and email template used to communicate with participants.







PHASE II: COMMUNITY CONVERSATIONS

During Phase II, we coordinated five (5) community conversation gatherings. The purpose of these meetings was to have a deeper conversation with residents about their vision for Palm Park. Meetings were held on various dates, times, and locations with a focus on hosting meetings in East Austin. Initially, we made great efforts to host our meetings at Sanchez Elementary and Martin Middle School, but it was a challenge in receiving a response from school staff. Instead, we contacted the Parent Support Specialist (PSS) at Palm Elementary in Southeast Austin and had great success in working with the school. The PSS was aware of the history of the Palm School and shared that many parents had families who attended the old Palm School, and

the principal was very supportive in hosting the meetings. The PSS helped our team in spreading the word to families, posting on the school social media, distributing flyers, and securing the meeting space. In addition to Palm Elementary, we also hosted meetings at Chalmers East Community Room and Rodolfo "Rudy" Mendez Recreation Center.

During our Community Conversations, we met with over 90 participants and **gathered 632 comments/ideas** for Palm Park. The Community Conversations were held for 1.5 hours and allowed us to have rich conversations. Free food and interpretation services were provided, as well as an area for youth activities and feedback. The information below provides a glance of the meeting participant data.

PHASE II: MEETING INSIGHTS

To kick-off the Community Conversations we gave a short presentation, providing an overview of Palm Park, reviewing the project timeline, and sharing how this information fit into the greater context of the design process. To create synergy among the attendees, we implemented an icebreaker activity that allowed participants to share "in one word" their vision for Palm Park. After the icebreaker, we coordinated small working groups where participants could discuss a list of preset questions guided by a facilitator. Participants were given post it notes where they could write down their response to the questions. Once each group went through their questions, we provided time toward the end of the meeting for groups to share their key insights

with the larger group. We found at every Community Conversation there was lively discussion, and we often went over time with the level of conversation that took place. During our meetings we also allowed time for Travis County staff to share updates on the progress for the Palm School Steering Committee. The general sense at the end of these meetings was that participants left feeling heard and informed about the process. Below are a few photos showing the interaction during our community conversations.









In our attempt to keep data consistent across each meeting, facilitators were given the same set of questions, and their role to walk participants through each question and encourage healthy dialogue. The questions were distributed into **three (3) topics**, which included:

- History, Culture, and Personal Stories
- Park Features
- Future Programs and Uses

With each topic, there were three guiding questions that would help spark conversation. Participants were encouraged to discuss ideas and post their comments so we could document their information. A full copy of the facilitator guide and data captured at each Community Conversation during Phase II can be found in the Appendix. In addition to group conversations, we had a youth activity table and area dedicated to capturing children's drawings. We encouraged children to share what they felt would bring them to the park and ideas for the types of activities they wanted to see. The meetings were truly family-friendly and there was an exciting energy at each meeting.









PHASE II: LESSONS LEARNED

Overall, we experienced the public's strong emotional connection to Palm Park. Participants often arrived at meetings reserved, concerned, or hesitant and after the conversations left feeling inspired, engaged, and heard.

We also made space to have hard and honest conversations when questioned about the design or process for the project. During our meetings, we stressed the importance of the community's input and made a commitment to ensure their voices would be reflected in the design. It's important to note, the design team from Waterloo Greenway was available at every meeting and played a key role in facilitating conversations. The project team took time to debrief upon each meeting and documented key insights we heard along the way. Upon completing Phase II, all the data gathered was summarized and shared with the design consultants, Michael Van Valkenburgh Associates (MVVA).



We also learned the community was innovative and thoughtful in their comments. They gave the project team lots of great ideas on how the public would want to use the park. Below are some responses we received to the question, "How would you like to use the park?"




As we saw in Phase I, preserving the history of Palm Park was a priority as well as honoring the Mexican American culture and experiences of past, current, and future residents of East Austin. Overall, we got the sense families felt this could be a destination park, where old meets new, and residents of East Austin felt was their own.







We also learned the importance of creating a meeting experience that both informs the public of what the design process entails and how their feedback gets incorporated. Rather than creating a meeting that was presentation heavy, we wanted the community to feel they were contributing and at the center of our work. We made every attempt to create boards that explained the process or provided a big picture of what designing a park means. We consistently reviewed information, so the public felt they were along for the process rather than being presented data. Ultimately, it was our goal to ensure they felt empowered that their voices matter in this process and it would be a park that reflected their ideas.



PHASE III: CO-CREATING A CONCEPT PLAN

During the months of January through April 2024, the project team began creating a Park Concept Plan using the feedback collected from Phases I and II. The project team, along with MVVA and Murray Legge Architecture, took a deep dive into the data and began finding ways to honor all the feedback received. The project team also reviewed the current structural, engineering, and environmental elements of the current Palm Park space to ensure future concepts would be accurate in size, dimensions, and capacities. As a result, we began planning for the final round of community meetings.

During Phase III, it was our goal to go back out to the community and share preliminary concept plans for Palm Park. We also wanted to hear from the public whether these plans were aligned with the feedback they shared during Phase I & II. The project team determined the best type of meeting to share the new design concepts would be a combination of a presentation format followed by a community discussion. Rather than hosting a series of meetings, we coordinated two large community meetings at various dates and times.


In March 2024, we began promoting the meetings utilizing the same engagement strategies we had incorporated throughout this project. To remain consistent with our marketing brand, we designed new flyers with similar graphics and set up the same Google form sign-up for meetings.






We worked with Austin Independent School District (AISD) to reserve meeting space at Martin Middle School and Eastside College High School, continuing our focus in hosting conversations in East Austin. We set one meeting to take place on a weeknight, Thursday, and the other on Saturday. To promote the meetings, we publicized the meeting through a series of press release, sent reminders via social media, and sent emails to the list of past participants. We had a positive response from the media with three articles that ran from Cultural Map Austin, Community Impact, and the Austin Monitor. This publicity was important because it cast information about our public meeting to a wide audience and brought visibility regarding the importance of these final meetings.








Our team also spent time tabling at community events and sharing updates. We attended events like STEAM Fest which was held at Martin Middle School, Bike to UT Day, and the Eastside Community School Alliance Monthly Meeting. We also distributed flyers to Eastside Early College High School, Martin Middle School, Sanchez Elementary, and Mendez Recreation Center. We shared information with City Council members and asked for them to promote via their monthly e-newsletters. We also sent personal emails to key Latino leaders who had not participated in Phase II, providing updates about the upcoming meetings and inviting to meet with them separately if needed. Overall, we had a total of 30 participants and collected a little over 100 comments regarding the Palm Park Concept Design. Despite the low participation, we felt the marketing, promotion, and community engagement was aligned with our previous outreach. While we had hoped for a greater number of participants, we used the time with individuals who did attend to have more in-depth conversations. We did see community members return from previous engagement events and were curious to see the outcome of the input. The chart below captures the information we gathered on participants who attended.



PHASE III: LESSONS LEARNED


During Phase III, the goal of the Design Community Conversations was to learn whether the Palm Park Concept plan reflected what the public envisioned for the park. We also wanted to know what stood out, what might be missing, or what new insights need to be considered. During the meeting, MVVA designed the presentation using themes they gathered from the data to discuss how they built the plan. The photo below represents the themes they used to design the park concept plan.



During the presentation, MVVA provided examples of the type of park features that could represent each theme and the options that might be possible. Along with these themes, MVVA identified **six (6) main areas** on the concept plan that addressed the most significant feedback the community shared. The diagram below describes the (6) areas in the concept plan and they generally include: how the plan would respect Palm Park's history, what ways the plan would maintain potential connection to Palm School, how the plan would preserve existing trees, and what were some possible considerations for meaningful uses of the park.



Ultimately, the design team shared the following Concept Plan reflecting how the themes had been integrated into various possible uses at Palm Park.



After the presentation, the community discussed their thoughts on the Concept Plan. We had project team facilitators review a set of questions (Appendix) and we gathered comments. Like Phase II, we also had community members share out their major takeaways from their discussion with the larger group. We heard an array of comments, but one that stood out is whether a park focused on children was the right fit for downtown. Given the growing number of high-rise apartments and single occupancy dwellings, some participants felt there was a missed opportunity for single adult activity. We also learned that if there will be a focus on children and families, then there needs to be easy access to the park particularly as it relates to parking. Participants shared the constraints of parking at other famous Austin parks and feared families would have a difficult time bringing young ones if there was not a safe and accessible way to get to Palm Park. In addition, we heard that if there was a focus on children then considerations need to be made for age sensitive water fountains, stroller parking, and restrooms.

Other considerations participants shared was the materials for play features particularly given the Texas heat. Recommendations were made to consider hazards and visibility for parents around water features and more flexible seating options at the park. Another concern was the proximity to IH-35 and whether safety as well as noise preventing measures would be in place. We also had great insights shared by the deaf community and ways to make the park more accessible to all types of abilities. Recommendations they asked the team to consider were sign language art, a story tree with braille, and sculptures that provided hand sensory activities. The comments received during the Design Conversations were broad but gave the project team another round of

data to consider moving forward. A full list of all the comments received during Phase III can be found in the Appendix.

PHASE III: NEXT STEPS

As the work closes on community engagement, the project now moves into full design. The next steps are for the project team to build in cost estimates and determine what is feasible at Palm Park. As the team determines possible park features, there will be a future workshop intended for youth to co-design a playground structure at Palm Park. The team will also begin presenting to key stakeholders, boards and commissions, as well as City leadership. Ultimately, the goal is for construction on Palm Park to begin in 2026, following completion of Waterloo Greenway's current construction work at The Confluence.
