## **Park Design Services**

#### Offered by Austin Parks Foundation



**Overall Park Planning** Process guides neighborhood groups through visioning and creating an adopted Park Concept Plan

#### Awarded:

- Once a year to neighborhood, school or pocket parks only
- Spring Application date
- Jamestown Neighborhood Park is the 2023-2024 recipient

#### **Process:**

- Up to Year-long process
- Conduct Site Inventory and Analysis
- Community Outreach including three public meetings
   and three public surveys
- Develop Concept Plan based on input

#### Outcome: Adopted Park Concept Plan by City of Austin

### Jamestown Neighborhood Park

### What is a Neighborhood Park?

- Backbone of Austin's park system
- Respond to demographic and cultural characteristics of neighborhoods
- Provide basic recreational opportunities close to home
- Ideally, all citizens have easy access to a neighborhood park within one-mile of their residences
- 2 to 30 acres in size
- Traditional recreation opportunities such as playgrounds, basketball and tennis courts, open play areas, and picnic tables
- Less traditional recreation opportunities such as wildflowers, native plants, less intensive maintenance techniques
- Does not typically include: dog parks, splash pads, pools, pickleball courts




