

### **GAP ANALYSIS**

Nature defict scores annually updated for gap analysis of elementary school(s).

### **COLLECT CITY-WIDE DATA**

Measure outcomes and metrics for entire current CCCN action plan area.

### **IDENTIFY FOCUS SCHOOL**

Identify highest need elementary schools with JUAs.

### **COLLECT PILOT DATA**

Measure outcomes at individual school level.

# PARD AISD COMMUNITY NON-PROFIT ORG HEALTH SECTOR

### **IDENTIFY PARTNER ORGS**

Use annually updated CCCN program survey to identify organizations currently active at focus school(s) & identify trusted community leaders to provide CCCN pilot project input / feedback.

### **EXECUTE PLAN**

Move forward with action plan.

## CREATE COMMON AGENDA

Work with School & Community partners to refine a common agenda at focus elementary school(s).

### **CREATE PROJECT PLAN**

Draft pilot incubation project action plan using a logic model and collective impact 5 conditions.

### **CCCN INCUBATOR PILOT PROJECT - SCHOOL SELECTION PROCESS / FACTORS**

**School Selection Consensus:** We cannot just pick a school we think is the best candidate and force the project on them. We need a certain level of buy-in and commitment from the participating school.

### **School Selection Options:**

- 1. Talk to all potential Pilot Schools, Gauge Interest, Select school based on Need, Interest level and Resources
- 2. Open up School Selection as a type of "competition" between a number of pre-selected school. Application Process should be low impact.
- 3. Partner with UT School of Public Health to conduct Pilot Project as an academic study school selection would need to align with academic standards for a viable study

### **Factors to Consider in School Selection:**

- Is there an appetite at this school?
- Is there an established community around the school we can work with?
- What resources exist that would set the project up for success long-term?
- What are the barriers to making the project sustainable at this school?
- What is the level of crime in the area?
- What major access / transportation barriers exists in getting to the school?

### What additional information do we need to have before we start reaching out to schools?

- What is the benefit for the school?
- What will they need to put in?
- What is the scale of the project?
- What resources can PARD & AISD allocate?
- We will need to provide teacher training in addition to physical resources we provide
