- No more parking lots
- Barton Springs Road becoming freeway
- Could be better
- No new building bathhouse. Education Center. Make it up to code
- Want to know if it can be up to code
- Confusing entrance
- Currently like a prison entrance
- Easy access from pool into exhibit
- More cooperation between Aquatic and PARD
- Splash to be more integrated with the pool
- More defined—Not signs Circulation—Natural
- Broader Visitor Orientation place—Bathhouse
- Splash first class, museum quality
- Watershed pump up educational component that is a change from when it was opened in 1996

Dressing Area:

- Table agree some improvements could be made
- Cleanly and comfortable
- Water sanitation—ease of use
- Improve sense of safe security at site / women's restroom
- Keep an eye on things. Know who is in the room with you.
- Love plants
- Open to sky—Open Air

- Ladies restroom gets used for storage wheel barrow / tools
- Like men's restroom—How open it is
- Women's not open enough—Need lighting
- Accommodate storage so restrooms stay
- Get rid of another solar shower
- Fixtures should be new with retro look / feel
- Low-flow toilets
- Maintain restroom facilities free to part (?)
- ADA accessible—slip resistant
- Shower area integrated for privacy and open up the dressing area

Rotunda:

- Trip advisor. Top ten places to visit BSP
- Visitor Center for the entire park is a need
- Arrival point
- The splash needs to remain. Need water quality must be taught
- Needs to be thought out comprehensively
- Health science in addition to science education
- What does the site mean for fish and wildlife
- Update the education and splash
- Rotunda and splash become one
- Relocating education center—Interactive science and health based as well as water quality. Hands on center
- Education center to become the entrance into the park—give the world class feel
- Visitor center in rotunda to also be educational as well as informational—cultural feel

Aquatic Sheffield Splash Support Space:

- Clearly not enough space
- Moving education center and splash to a site near BSP to utilize the space for support services
- Life and safety need to be closest—Find space for
- Reconfigure both men and women. Could capture additional space
- Gain space by efficiency
- Place a restroom facility on the southside
- Do not have the rotunda as an entrance
- Open both sides of the pool on northside
- If automatic individuals bring cooler into the pool / would need to be monitored
- Pre-purchase tickets online
- Tickets available for purchase at the rotunda but not use as an entrance

Parking/Approach:

- More mass transit
- More bicycle racks
- 90% of the time: yes
- Not enough parking—all agree
- Re-stripe parking lot for smaller spaces
- Bring satellite (?) into compliance
- Add trails for easier access
- Renovate existing trails
- Relocate zephyr playscape –spread out
- Pool staff & concession –designated parking spots – move to upper parking lot
- ADA spots @ ZHT

- Open to everyone when ZHT is closed?
- Large PL under mopac off Stratford—shuttles from there
- Multi-use trail along Zephyr tracks to PL near Pecan Grove—for emergency ADA (?)

Dressing Areas:

- No need for (?) privacy
- More electrical outlets
- More hot showers, especially in men's
- Lower down faucets
- Replace automated faucets
- Mortar between tiles is decrepit
- Re-mortar before it gets worse
- Concrete changing stalls
- (?) is unsightly
- Take out concrete stalls. Replace with something with roof
- Please keep plants and maintain courtyard feeling
- Do not redo like Deep Eddy
- If there's need for another family bathroom, should go in area used for staff/aquatics
- Better and lower shower heads
- Presentation should have photos for better discussion
- Any work should result in minimal closures of pool

Rotunda:

- More drinking fountains are needed throughout bathhouse zone
- Some really like Splash as is.
- Others think it could be much better and space could be better utilized

- Better signage is needed
- Print “Visit Splash!” and info on back of ticket
- Continue staff interpretive efforts—more staff
- Better use of rotunda as visitor’s counter
- Better exhibits in rotunda. Perhaps a gift shop
- Ask the kids what they think of the exhibit
- Would there be an option to maintain Splash! With flood resistant materials
- Use existing windows for emergency access?
- KEEP POOL OPEN
- If moving entrance to Rotunda adversely affects educational aspect, then don’t do it
- Patio at backdoor of rotunda would make great picnic area
- Rotunda is architecturally beautiful—new design should enhance that

Support Facilities:

- Do not move entrance to rotunda. Buying tickets online (or at Rotunda entrance) and only use tickets to pass through gate
- Return rotunda to original function
- Automatic east & west gate
- Gift shop in rotunda where tickets can be purchased
- Ban aerosol sunscreens
- How would families navigate through bathhouse? Split gardens?
- Spend tax dollars elsewhere
- Meetings should take place during spring/summer when there’s more interest in the pool. If public input were totally valued

Around the Bathhouse:

- Definitely not enough parking
- Too much cross traffic from trail
- People going wrong way on one way
- Busy time does not allow easy direction
- Find ways to provide alternative (?)
- Too many amenities in one area
- Lack of parking
- Better accessible path to and from other parking areas
- Preserve trees if path are developed
- Better signage
- Provide rain gardens off parking
- Provide road raised crossing area
- Lack of mass transportation plan
- Clearly marked bike path
- Make entrance to pool better
- Install automatic entrance
- Make more entrances to pool

Dressing Area:

- Not attractive, need to be spiffed up
- Hot water for showers—more
- Like the open area
- Does not fit in circulation
- Locker not identified—not enough
- Not utilized

- Re-open the women's dressing room
- Dressing room need more
- Better signage on (?) restroom (?)
- Water (?)
- No metal toilet seats
- Need unisex restrooms
- Repair concrete shade structures
- Get rid of plastic (?) on showers
- Reopen the gates to front rotunda dressing room
- Don't move lifeguard unless it is needed
- Move lifeguard to give more space in dressing area (women's)
- Don't close in any more of dressing area
- Better access to public restroom
- Keep elective outlets in dressing area

Rotunda:

- Splash location is in the best location and upgraded if needed
- Splash exhibit does not have amenities it needs to provide service
- May be better location uphill towards BS road for splash. But will require ADA Path and preserve trees and ponds
- Possible open gates to both sides of Rotunda
- May keep some part of (?) in Rotunda if splash moves
- Leave splash in place. It is sufficient
- Make entrance to pool through Rotunda
- Keep an open area with large windows and natural light for exhibit. No ticket selling in Rotunda

- Use east side classroom for storage and staff
- Keep east side classroom as is
- Be okay to sell tickets to pool with cash

Support Facilities:

- There is definitely a need for additional entrance or automatic entrance
- Add exit on west side of building
- Need more space for lifeguards
- Need space for down time for lifeguards
- Don't move lifeguards space office. It is better in that area
- Spiff up existing lifeguards
- Provide better office space for lifeguard for personal issues
- Better changing area for lifeguards
- Build a facility for storage
- Keep visual location to pool for lifeguards
- Make rotunda for entrance
- Provide better and more office space for splash
- Use some space in men's dressing room for storage similar to lifeguard in women's
- Make visitors center for park in park other than at bathhouse

- City should open up parks and provide shuttle service
- Expand existing lots

- Shuttles
- Off site parking. Remote parking
- Remove all parking adjacent to pool – create park, replace a top. Increase bike park
- Define designated ped, bike lanes
- Allow only shuttles, handicap
- Add rain gardens to filter water
- Leave parking as is
- Combine transit with entry to pool
- Use Tony Burger Center for parking and shuttle
- Women's stays as is. Repair (?) in shower (?)
- Upgrade shower heads, curtains
- Functional repair
- Open women's to original intent
- Women's size adequate
- Difficult to clean, crowded
- Women's should look more like men's
- Like the enclosed feel, individual stalls
- Women's privacy is key
- Provide privacy but move aquatic staff
- Survey should be done to determine if women's area needs to be changed

- Need family changing rooms
- Family changing for both genders
- Courtyard concept great
- Drinking fountains in courtyard
- Personal storage – coin operated
- Signage needed
- Lighting is ok

Rotunda:

- Use as ticket station
- Automated machine
- Open as an entry
- Use partition to separate uses
- Return to operations
- Constrict area for splash elsewhere
- Historical use
- Keep education / splash viable
- Move of site (out of bathroom) to adjacent area

Staff Support and Facilities:

- No does not serve the zone, splash, fobs
- More entrances at peak time
- Automated entry—w/ turnstiles
- Splash exhibit updated
- Update technology for splash, rotunda
- It is important for education that tech cannot address (programming)

- Staffing splash
- Self sufficiency
- Storage (?)
- Office space—not functioning
- Move splash – improve
- Follow (?) plan – to intended use
- Make flood resistant
- Improve vehicular access by providing shuttle
- Easier accessibility
- Intended as historic structure – ticketing
- No, it is not sufficient
- Too much w/ the bathhouse should be a bathhouse added education and buses adds traffic
- Most important for storage to operate pool
- Need changes to entrance
- Use rotunda as entrance and experience the pool, visitor center, “go to” Barton springs master plan
- Needs several entrances
- Should be more open, enter at Eliza
- Exit could be dangerous, needs more exits
- The showers and toilets are disproportionate to amount of users
- Combine bathrooms inside and outside
- Moving education out of the bathhouse wouldn’t capture visitors to the pool
- Priority—restore main entrance to rotunda
- Parking, there is no solution, people need to take alternatives to get there

- Free admission could be problematic due to homeless users of pool
- Already problems with folks east of damn, don't want to invite them to pool
- Free users stay and don't leave
- Solution—Sheffield could be its own separate building—could alleviate entrance problems to pool, restore bathhouse
- Maintenance barn is not ideal for Sheffield because it is not visible
- Sheffield should be close to habitat
- Sheffield should go in current concessions area

Dressing Areas:

- Men's restrooms need family restroom for children w/ privacy
- No the dressing areas are not sufficient
- Needs flood-proof plumbing and electrical
- Number of toilets and showers are sufficient but not always in use
- Improvements to use what's there
- More sinks
- Improved and modern fixtures
- The restrooms to not serve 12,000 users
- Second floor attack is usable space
- Emergency box alarm in restrooms needed
- Modernize lockers, use coins
- No they are not sufficient
- Needs to be state of the art and preserve historic nature
- Needs family rooms in both men and women's
- Has enough room

- Needs reconfiguring
- Needs to accommodate more people
- Changing rooms could be better used
- Could be used as storage
- People need more privacy
- Should be designed to be its best
- Not concerned with nefarious activity

Rotunda Area:

- No. The amenities are not sufficient
- Things in the building that can be damaged should be moved
- We should be proactive about moving things out of flood plain
- Build visitor center
- Could move Sheffield center up on cliff across from bathhouse
- Turn low parking lot area into pedestrian area
- Sheffield exhibit serves adequately
- Priorities—mitigate problems w/ respect to flood
- Use facility as visitor center that can withstand flood
- Visitor center w/ park information
- Rotunda should be used as safe exit
- Funding priorities—restoration, replacing education experience out of flood area
- Visitor services
- Well designed entrance and exit
- Visitor information
- Entrance and exit—high priorities

- Things prone to flooding should be moved
