Presentation 1: Programming (Rachel, Nicole)

- Participant Barbara Scott asked if this site is only providing programming to older adults with disabilities?
 - Isn't sure if older adults would want to be around children 5 and under? They do not see this model working in current times.
 - Not sure if this current programming meets the needs of older adults of today who are much more active and not sure if they want to be around younger children
 - Discussed how were questions asked for the feasibility studies?
 - Most of the older adults she talked to were not interested in this site and programming. Not reflective of what older adults currently want or need.
- Participant Diane Rouda discussed her work talking to older adults about mentoring. She helps do mentoring at schools, after school programs, etc.
 - She notes older adults showing interest in mentoring
 - Her program works well because it provides a stipend to older adults. This is beneficial to lower income older adults.
 - \circ $\;$ Needs of children of today very different then former years.
 - Some older adults like to spend time with kids, very different needs among the older adult population
 - She thinks this is a great opportunity but is not for all older adults.
- Barbra Scott reiterated this programming is not for all older adults and is concerned that surveys are written to get the answers the city needs.
- Participant Ashika Raval is more curious about the interaction that will occur between older adults and children.

 - High percentage of low-income older adults in 78702, 78721, and 78741
 - Gave recap on project history
 - Provided the proposal of the IRAC at Nash Hernandez and the conceptual model of the space.
- Participant Clarke Heidrick shared that he thinks this proposal will be a great benefit for the area due to RBJ and he is a member of the RBJ Advisory Committee, and they support.
